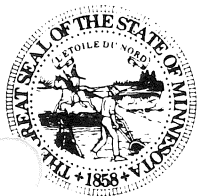

REORGANIZATION ORDER NO. 162

Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1988, Section 16B.37, the following administrative reorganization is made with the prior approval of the Governor.

In order to improve efficiency and avoid duplication in the operation of state government, the Department of Health's duties for OSHA health consulting services under the federal Occupational Safety and Health Consultant Program grant (Occupational Safety and Health Act Of 1970, P.L. 91-596, Sec. 7 (c) (1)) are transferred to the Department of Labor and Industry effective October 1, 1990.

Consistent with this transfer of duties, the following positions and their incumbents, with all accrued benefits, are transferred from the Department of Health to the Department of Labor and Industry:

Nothing in this order shall be construed as abrogating or modifying any rights now enjoyed by affected employees under the managerial or commissioner's plan under Minnesota Statutes 1988, Section 43A.18 or the terms of an agreement between an exclusive representative of public employees and the state or one of its appointing authorities.

The complement of the Department of Health is decreased by 3.15 federal fund and 0.35 general fund positions. The complement of the Department of Labor and Industry as provided by Laws 1989, Chapter 335, Article 1, Section 30, is increased by 3.15 federal fund and 0.35 general fund positions. The sum of \$20,030 in general funds, representing the state's 10% matching funds for the federal OSHA Consultation Grant, shall be transferred from the Department of Health to the Department of Labor and Industry.

The Department of Health shall give to the Department of Labor and Industry all contracts, books, maps, plans, papers, records, supplies, and equipment relating to the transferred duties.

Rulemaking authority for the OSHA health consulting services is transferred to the Department of Labor and Industry. All rules adopted by the Department of Health pursuant to these duties remain in effect and shall be enforced until amended or repealed in accordance with law by the Department of Labor and Industry.


The Department of Labor and Industry is the legal successor in all respects of the Department of Health in regard to the transferred duties. The bonds, resolutions, contracts, and liabilities of the Department of Health become the bonds, resolutions, contracts, and liabilities of the Department of Labor and Industry.

Any proceeding, court action, prosecution, or other business or matter pending on the effective date of the transfer may be conducted and completed by the Department of Labor and Industry in the same manner under the same terms and conditions, and with the same effect, as though it involved or were commenced and conducted or completed prior to the transfer by the Department of Health.

The Commissioner of Finance shall make the necessary financial determinations in accordance with Minnesota Statutes 1988, Section 16B.37, subdivision 3.

In accordance with Minnesota Statutes 1988, Section 16B.37, subdivision 2, this order is effective upon filing with the Secretary of State and shall remain in effect until amended or repealed.
