Pursuant to Minnesota Statutes 1969, Sections 16.125, 16.13, and 16.135.

I, Richard L. Brubacher, as Commissioner of Administration, do hereby order the transfer of functions, employees, and appropriations as set forth below and as approved by the Governor, and order to become effective on October 7, 1970.

The functions of the Department of Highways related to the operation and maintenance of an electronic data processing center are hereby transferred to the Department of Administration, and the element of the Department of Highways known as the "Data Processing Unit" is hereby transferred to and made a part of the Department of Administration, Computer Services Division. For the purposes of this order the term "functions" shall include all equipment, material, supplies, and space presently in the possession of and occupied by the Department of Highways, Data Processing Unit, in the Highway Building with the understanding that the depreciated value of such equipment, material, supplies, and space originally purchased through the Trunk Highway Fund will be credited to it.

The following positions and their incumbents at their present salaries are hereby transferred from the Department of Highways to the Department of Administration, and the approved 1971 complement of the Department of Highways Administration as set forth in Laws 1969, Chapter 800, Section 2, Subdivision 1 and as subsequently reduced by Reorganization Order No. 3 is hereby reduced from 287 to 224:
