A Proclamation of National Hearing Week

- WHEREAS, at least three million children in the United States have a hearing loss and millions of adults are already hard of hearing; and
- WHEREAS, authorities further estimate that one out of every ten persons in our nation has a hearing loss, ranging from a slight loss to almost total deafness; and
- WHEREAS, loss of hearing is an obstacle to normal social and business relationships and can be a severe handicap to success; and
- WHEREAS, medical experts state that the majority of people with serious hearing defects would never have reached that unfortunate stage if the trouble had been checked in the incipient stage; and
- WHEREAS, this obstacle must be overcome through research, a more widespread application of existing knowledge and the overcoming of the individual's personal reluctance to recognize his own hearing defect;
