A Proclamation for "Hungarian Day"

WHEREAS, American citizens of Hungarian ancestry usually observe the "Hungarian Independence Day" on March 18, in a historically celebrated festivity known as the "Ides of March"; and

WHEREAS, appropriate commemorative ceremonies will be held and a special message will be broadcast by Americans of Hungarian descent to the people of Hungary so as to help keep their hopes alive and reaffirm the principles of democracy during this time when they are under totalitarian rule; and


WHEREAS, Minnesota is proud of its citizens of Hungarian descent and of the many contributions which they have made to the building of the commonwealth;

NOW, WHEREFORE, I, LAWRENCE W. THORNDIKE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 18 as
