PROCLAMATION

Proclamation for Minnesota's National Week

WHEREAS, one of the major obligations and responsibilities of a civilized society, a responsibility which is shared by government, by public and private organizations, and by other voluntary private organizations, is to provide for the needs and the welfare of the people and particularly to be concerned with them in times of peace, war, or other hardships or special circumstances, various laws to meeting their physical, social and spiritual needs and

WHEREAS, various agencies of government and many private organizations are dedicated to meeting the welfare of the people and are carrying out this task through the efforts of governmentally trained and skilled personnel and with the assistance of countless local citizens and volunteers who give of their time, resources, and ability to contribute to the welfare and happiness of others; and

WHEREAS, these agencies and individuals are joined together in the Minnesota National Conference, which, during the month of March, is leading the thirty-fourth annual meeting to consider various objectives in meeting the needs of the people and citizens by which these needs can be met most effectively; and

WHEREAS, it is of utmost importance to the success of these efforts, both public and private, that the people of Minnesota become fully aware of the needs that exist, of the common objectives to meet these needs, of the many agencies, both State and local, which are working to carry out an effective program, and of the many ways that might be taken to meet these needs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Axel L. Brown, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of March 19th to 25, 1957 as

MINNESOTA NATIONAL WEEK

and urge all citizens of Minnesota to give particular attention during that week to the problems that exist, to the efforts of our various agencies to meet vital human needs and to the results of such efforts in bringing about higher standards of health, of economic development, of social progress, and of human happiness.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed to this Proclamation this fourth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the State, the thirty-ninth.
