

PROCLAMATION

OF THE GOVERNOR

IN OBSERVANCE OF "LOYALTY DAY"

- WHEREAS, we in the United States are privileged to live under a government characterized by ideals of freedom and democracy, by principles of justice and equality of opportunity for all; and
- WHEREAS, we believe that the maintenance of these principles is of paramount importance to our history and
- WHEREAS, there exists in the world forces which if given the opportunity would be destructive of these principles and could constitute a threat to the continued progress of our free American way of living; and
- WHEREAS, constant vigilance on the part of those who believe in our principles and a thorough understanding of their meaning and significance is vitally needed at this critical period in world history;

AND, WHEREAS, I, Carlisle L. Spear, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 1, 1957 as

LOYALTY DAY

and urge all people to give serious attention to the values to which we in the United States owe much more than the freedom, to which we owe a just and equitable loyalty, and declare our all intention to act in such a way as will contribute most to the strengthening of the United States of America and the principles of freedom.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirteenth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the State the ninety-eighth.
