A Proclamation for "Mother's Day" 1957

WHEREAS, the first official Mother's Day was founded on Sunday, May 10, 1908 and since that date the celebration of this event designed to honor our mothers has grown in significance and observance; and

WHEREAS, it is fitting that we set aside the second Sunday of each May as a day of official homage to our mothers and that we observe the day by family and religious gatherings; and

WHEREAS, Sunday, May 12th, 1957 has been designated Mother's Day throughout the nation;

I, THOMAS F. FRIZELL, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim May 12, 1957 as

MOTHER'S DAY

and urge all citizens to set aside this day on which to honor the mothers who have done so much to make possible the growth and progress of our state and the happiness of its citizens.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capital this thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the ninety-ninth.
