EXECUTIVE ORDER

1957 NO. 1

WHEREAS, on April 25, 1957 I signed into law House File No. 2087 of the 1957 Legislature which amends Minnesota Statutes 1953, section 615.07; and

WHEREAS, this law provides that on such dates established by the Governor of the State of Minnesota, the standard of time in this state shall be one hour ahead of the mean solar time of the ninetieth meridian of longitude west of Greenwich, commonly known as Central Standard Time, so that time in use in this state will be in practicable conformance with time other than standard time in use elsewhere in the nation;

HEN, THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby order that beginning at 12:10 a.m. on Sunday, April 28, 1957 and ending at 11:59 p.m. on Saturday, October 26, 1957, the time in use in this state shall be one hour ahead of such solar time.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fifth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-seven and of the state, the ninety-ninth.
