A PROCLAMATION FOR "DORISLAY WEEK"

WHEREAS, THE ORDER OF DORISLAY is a character-building organization that accepts any young man between the ages of fourteen and twenty-one, who will dedicate himself to attaining the high moral standards set by the Order; and

WHEREAS, each member of the Order of Dorislay vows to be a better son, to love and serve God and his country, to be courteous and faithful to his fellowman, to honor and protect every woman, to practice tolerance towards others, to aid and uphold our public institutions and precious freedoms, and to fulfill all obligations as upright and public-spirited citizens before God and man; and

WHEREAS, each Chapter of the Order of Dorislay is required to observe the following obligatory days: Parents' Day, Dorislay Day of Comfort, Devotional Day, Educational Day, Patriots' Day, and My Government Day; and

WHEREAS, the Order of Dorislay features state-wide projects such as Anticommunism, Antinarcotics, Civil Defense, Blood Donations, the Teen-Age Safety Crusade, Civic Service and Vacation Guidance.

NOW, WHEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, recognizing the valuable attributes of this young men's organization, and by virtue of the authority vested in me, do hereby proclaim August 24th through August 30th, 1959 as

"DORISLAY WEEK"

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this fourteenth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and fifty-nine, and of the state, the one hundred second.
