A PROCLAMATION FOR "CAMP FIRE GIRLS FOUNDERS DAY"

WHEREAS, on March 17, 1960, Camp Fire Girls, Inc., marks its fiftieth anniversary; and,

WHEREAS, this national youth organization, one of the oldest in the United States, is to be commended for its outstanding program combining fun, friendship, service and high ideals;

WHEREAS, Camp Fire Girls makes available to all girls of every race, religion and economic status from age seven years through high school an educational-recreational program designed to develop qualities and talents in gentle living and good citizenship; and,

WHEREAS, this state and the whole family of states, derives benefit and pleasure from Camp Fire Girls program and the exceptionally valuable services rendered continuously by its members to the community such as giving valuable assistance in conservation work, acting as hospital, museum and library aides, giving service to homes for foundlings, handicapped children and the aged, co-operating in numerous civic activities, and providing valuable training for adult volunteer leadership and citizenship,

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Thursday, March 17, 1960, as

"CAMP FIRE GIRLS FOUNDERS DAY"

a time for the citizens of this State to unite with the Camp Fire Girls organization in marking a significant milestone in its impressive history of service to youth over a period of a half-century.
