A PROCLAMATION FOR "NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK"

WHEREAS, the use of libraries is of vital importance for the information and education of all citizens; and,
WHEREAS, our Minnesota program for the development and improvement of public library services is making excellent progress; and,
WHEREAS, it behooves all citizens and public officials to recognize the value of the library services they now have, or to take the initiative in establishing good library service where it is presently unavailable; and,
WHEREAS, by calling attention to library needs and library development we may make still more progress in obtaining the goal of good library service for every Minnesotan;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 3rd through 9th, 1960, as

"LIBRARY WEEK IN MINNESOTA"

and urge all citizens to join with the observance of National Library Week during the same period through visits to and use of their libraries and the support of library programs this week and during the entire year.
