

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, it is to the vital interest of all citizens of the United States that we possess a sound national defense; and,

WHEREAS, since 1922 the day of October 27 has been celebrated locally and nationally as "Navy Day", a day on which our civilian population honors and pays grateful tribute to our mighty sea-air Navy and its heroic men and women - both living and dead - for their patriotism, loyalty, efficiency and devotion to duty;

NOW THEREFORE, I, Orville L. Freeman, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 27, 1960 as

"NAVY DAY"

and call upon all citizens of the State of Minnesota to display the national flag and take part in appropriate observance of this day through the many channels open to them.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-fifth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred sixty and of the State the one hundred third.
