WHEREAS, on May 1, 1961, American citizens will pay tribute to the indispensable roles of the law and the courts in our way of life; and

WHEREAS, the laws of our country administered by free and independent courts secure to the inhabitants of our country the rights and privileges guaranteed by our Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the observance renews our faith in the rule of law as the surest safeguard of the welfare of men and women living together in organized society, and the brightest hope for achieving peace in a troubled and perplexed world; and


WHEREAS, respect for the law which governs us, as administered by courts where the rights of men are equal, is essential for the preservation of the democratic form of government,


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim May 1, 1961, as


"LAW DAY U.S.A."
