A PROCLAMATION FOR "ANIMAL HEALTH MONTH"

WHEREAS, the State of Minnesota is vitally concerned with the health of its domestic animals; and,

WHEREAS, the health of animals affects every Minnesotan through the use of meat, milk, and eggs on our family tables; and,

WHEREAS, many leaders in agriculture and animal health fields are concerned with the food we as the consumers eat; and,

WHEREAS, under the direction of the Department of Agriculture of the State of Minnesota, the foods we eat, of these, meat, milk, and eggs must take their rightful places high on the list of being free from disease;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer L. Andersen, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of October, 1962, as

"ANIMAL HEALTH MONTH"

as a reminder to the people of Minnesota that animal health is no longer just the concern of the producer but of the entire American public. Tremendous strides have been made in the past few years in the development of drugs to be used in the health field. The Department of Agriculture is to be commended for the detection of disease and for the high quality of foods which are produced by our farmers.
