ORDINANCE NO. 30
VILLAGE ORDINANCE ANNEXING
LAND

The Village Council of the Village of Convik, Minnesota, do hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I. The following described land, abutting the municipality of Convik, Minnesota, is hereby annexed to and made a part of the incorporated territory of the Village of Convik, Minnesota, to-wit:

A tract of land located in the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the West boundary line of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, where said boundary line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way line of said railway as the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said Quarter line of the Southeast Quarter a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet, thence at right angles and East a distance of Four Hundred Twenty (420) Feet thence at right angles and South to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway, thence Northwesterly along the railway right of way line to the point of beginning, and

A tract of land described as follows: Commencing at a point on the West quarter line of the Southwest Quarter of the Southeast Quarter (SW $\frac{1}{4}$ SE $\frac{1}{4}$) Section Ten

(10) Township One Hundred forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian according to the government survey thereof, where said quarter line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way, thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way of said railway as the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said quarter line a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet; thence West at 90 degrees, a distance of Ninety-eight and four tenths (98.4) Feet; thence South at 90 degrees, to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway; thence Northwesterly along the railway right of way line to the point of beginning, said tract being a tract of land 98.4 Feet wide and located in the Southeast Quarter of the Southwest Quarter (SE $\frac{1}{4}$ SW $\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian according to the government survey thereof.

SECTION II. The Village Council of the Village of Convik hereby determine that the annexation of the above described tracts of land will be to the best interest of the municipality of Convik, Minnesota, and of the above described territory and that this annexation is made pursuant to M. S. A. Section 414.03, Subdivision 2.

VILLAGE ORDINANCE ANNEXING LAND

SECTION 1. The following described land, abutting the municipality of Convick, Minnesota, is hereby annexed to and made a part of the incorporated territory of the Village of Convick, Minnesota, to-wit:

A tract of land located in the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW¹/₄SE¹/₄) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, described as follows, to-wit:

Commencing at a point on the west boundary line of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW¹/₄SE¹/₄), Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, where said boundary line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way, thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way line of said railway as the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said quarter line of the Southeast quarter a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet, thence at right angles and East a distance of Four Hundred Twenty (420) Feet, thence at right angles and South to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway, thence Northwesterly along the railway right of way line, to the point of beginning, and

A tract of land described as follows:

Commencing at a point on the West quarter line of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW¹/₄SE¹/₄), Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, according to the government survey thereof, where said quarter line intersects the center line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway (presently known as the Soo Line) right of way, thence North Fifty (50) Feet to the North right of way line of said railway as the point of beginning; thence continuing North on said quarter line a distance of Four Hundred (400) Feet; thence West at 90°, a distance of Ninety-eight and four tenths (98.4) Feet; thence South at 90°, to the North right of way line of the Sault Ste. Marie Railway; thence Northeast-erly along the railway right of way line to the point of beginning, said tract being a tract of land 98.4 Feet wide and located in the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter (SE¹/₄SW¹/₄) of Section Ten (10), Township One Hundred Forty-nine (149) North, Range Thirty-eight (38) West, of the Fifth Principal Meridian, according to the government survey thereof.
