PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, twenty-one years ago, on October twenty-fourth 1945, the United Nations Charter came into force, and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has officially proclaimed October twenty-fourth 1966 as United Nations day in the United States, and

WHEREAS, the citizens of this state are fully aware that our survival requires worldwide cooperation; and that this country's highest hopes are in harmony with the hopes and aspirations of peoples everywhere, and

WHEREAS, the United Nations and its family of agencies has earned the esteem and respect of the citizens of this country and of this state for its practical achievements, which directly benefit each one of us in our daily lives, and help us to fulfill the humanitarian obligations which Americans have always tried to serve, and

WHEREAS, the success of the United Nations depends to a large extent on the good will and support of a well-informed public,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Karl F. Rolvaag, Governor of the State of Minnesota do hereby proclaim Monday, October 24, 1966, as

"UNITED NATIONS DAY"

and call upon all citizens of Minnesota to observe that day in a spirit of common purpose with the aims of the United Nations and participate in programs and activities designed to give support and encouragement to effective U. S. participation in the United Nations.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this thirteenth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-six and of the state, the one hundred ninth.
