PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, the production, processing and distribution of pork and pork products are recognized as an important segment of Minnesota's vast agricultural complex, and
- WHEREAS, pork is important to the health of Minnesota's citizens, providing nutrients essential to properly balanced diets, and
- WHEREAS, the Minnesota swine industry leads in the development of high-quality lean and tender pork cuts, and
- WHEREAS, pork is offered to the consumer in more than eighty different products, which can be enjoyed at any meal during the day,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Harold Levander, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim January 17-28, 1967, to be

"MINNESOTA PORK WEEK"

and do encourage all citizens of our great State to enjoy pork and pork products, and urge all civic and business organizations, farmers, distributors, retailers and the news media to unite in promoting Minnesota-produced pork.
