Whereas, the first Monday in September each year is by the laws of this State designated as a legal holiday, and

Whereas, it is advisable that one day of the year be set aside in honor of labor, and especially at this time, in gratefulness to wage workers for their splendid and untiring efforts in behalf of our Country in the prosecution of the war.

Therefore, Monday, September 2nd, 1918, is hereby proclaimed Labor Day and the citizens of our State are requested to fittingly observe this day so set apart.
