

PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS: American Education Week will be observed this year during the week of October 22nd through the 28th; the theme: Make Education Top Priority, and

WHEREAS: public education being available to the entire community - including community schools, vocational training and special education as well as the traditional focus - is essential to our freedom and helps secure many of the rights and privileges we have today, and

WHEREAS: the establishment and maintenance of good schools in the State of Minnesota is essential to our progress, prosperity and continuing development, and

WHEREAS: every citizen has a direct responsibility to help determine the goals of education and to establish education as top priority, and

WHEREAS: every citizen, in order to fulfill these responsibilities, must have an opportunity to learn about and understand the progress, problems and potential of the schools,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim October 22 - 28, 1972 as

AMERICAN EDUCATION WEEK

in Minnesota, and do urge all citizens to do all within their considerable power to make education top priority not only for those in our private and public schools but for the entire community.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this tenth day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-two and of the State, the one hundred fiftieth.
