

PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS: the Minnesota Pork Industry contributes a significant amount to our total farm income, and
- WHEREAS: the processing, marketing and distribution of pork contributes greatly to Minnesota's economy, and
- WHEREAS: the development of the meat type hog has produced lean meat and is no longer a high caloric meat, and
- WHEREAS: pork makes an outstanding contribution to the diets of consumers by containing a high amount of quality protein and substantial quantities of all the B vitamins and iron, and
- WHEREAS: the many cuts of pork such as loin roast, pork chops, ham, tenderloin, picnic shoulder and bacon all are delicious in flavor and are highly digestible;

HENCE, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of January 22, 1973 as

MINNESOTA PORK WEEK

and urge all citizens of this State to participate in this program of serving pork for their health and eating enjoyment plus the benefits to the economy of the State of Minnesota.
