



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Ralph Bledsoe was one of the unsung heroes of World War II; and

WHEREAS: Ralph Bledsoe was a U. S. Army operations officer with the 787th Engineer Petroleum Distribution Co. in charge of pipe-line support to the front lines; and

WHEREAS: fuel was not getting to the front lines fast enough; and

WHEREAS: Ralph Bledsoe devised a method, through use of a series of centrifugal pumps, that increased the flow of fuel by 12,000 barrels a day between Cherbourg, France, and Mainz, Germany; and

WHEREAS: this was the first time in history that centrifugal pumps in a series had been used on such a large scale; and

WHEREAS: the ingenuity and expertise of Ralph Bledsoe was a critical factor in winning the fuel supply battle, and thus in helping to win the Battle for Europe; and

WHEREAS: a break-through in Army bureaucracy was finally achieved when, on September 8, 1973, Ralph Bledsoe was awarded the Legion of Merit, an honor recommended in 1945;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, October 14, 1973 to be

RALPH BLEDSOE DAY

in Minnesota.
