



# Proclamation

- WHEREAS: U. W. Hella has been affectionately known as "Judge" throughout most of his life, an appropriate appellation to which he has brought distinction; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Hella has served Minnesota for twenty years as Director of State Parks with dedication and devotion to the highest standards of excellence; and
- WHEREAS: during those two decades, 70,836 acres were added to the state park system bringing it to 158,517 acres, a phenomenal growth of almost ninety percent; and
- WHEREAS: the Minnesota State Park system, the tenth largest in the nation, offers a wide variety of recreational opportunities; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Hella understands the value of State Parks, not only as sanctuaries to be protected and cherished, but as living laboratories where one can study a single flower, or a bird or a rock; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Hella's love for the land and commitment to the preservation of our natural heritage represent an enduring gift to all Minnesotans;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Tuesday, May 21, 1974 to be

JUDGE HELLA DAY

in Minnesota.
