



Proclamation

WHEREAS: *the energy crisis has brought home to Minnesotans the close interdependence of all people; and*

WHEREAS: *the recent meeting at the United Nations on utilization of the world's resources has focused attention on the problems of the industrial nations and the developing nations in using the world's resources wisely and fairly; and*

WHEREAS: *in 1974 we are endeavoring to plan a Law of the Sea Program so that our oceans may become the heritage of mankind; and*

WHEREAS: *an important meeting on population control was held this summer at Bucharest, Romania; and*

WHEREAS: *an important meeting will be held in Rome this fall on how to meet the world's food crisis;*

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Wendell R. Anderson, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Thursday, October 24, 1974 as

UNITED NATIONS DAY

in Minnesota and urge all citizens of Minnesota of all ages, to study and learn about these problems that affect us all deeply, and urge all churches, clubs, labor and business groups and all other civic groups to point up and emphasize the importance of the United Nations and doing cooperatively in harmony with all nations, what we can no longer do unilaterally due to our interdependence.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol this twenty-ninth day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and seventy-four and of the State the one hundred and sixteenth.
