
P R O C L A M A T I O N.

Saturday, November Fourth, is being observed as the annual National Forget-Me-Not day, in honor of America's wounded and disabled veterans of the World War. On this day forget-me-nots will be distributed to the citizens of various communities to remind them of our obligations to those who fought and suffered for us in the conflict of nations.

The funds raised on this day will be used for the welfare and relief, rehabilitation and employment, clubhouse and summer camp projects for the disabled American veterans. The American government has been liberal in its care of the disabled veterans, but obviously cannot do all the things that should be done for their comfort and enjoyment. The funds raised November fourth will provide some of these many needs and will give us an excellent opportunity to show that we have not forgotten our gratitude to those who fought our battles in 1917 and 1918.

NOW THEREFORE, I, J. A. O. Preus, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby urge and request that Forget-Me-Not Day be observed in all parts of this state and I hereby call upon our citizens both to support the organizations which are raising funds for the care of the disabled and to do everything else possible to lighten the burdens and add to the comforts of the service men wherever they may be found.
