

Proclamation

WHEREAS: prior to 1945 vocational-technical education in Minnesota was limited in programs offered and people served; and

WHEREAS: Walter Rogosheske saw the need for expanding vocational training programs to provide job training to returning war veterans; and

WHEREAS: his dedication to the state's economy and the needs of Minnesotan's led to landmark legislation for the state and nation; and

WHEREAS: this legislation was signed into law on April 16, 1945 and is known as the Area Vocational School Enabling Act; and


WHEREAS: this legislation has led to the serving of 27,000 students within the 33 area vocational-technical institutes in 1977;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim April 21, 1977 as


ROGOSHESKE DAY


in honor of Justice Walter Rogosheske for being instrumental in the development of vocational-technical education and in the welfare of the citizens of the State of Minnesota.
