



# Proclamation

- WHEREAS: the community action program "Consumer Education Week" has been successfully demonstrated in a number of communities over the past few years; and
- WHEREAS: this program on the community level is coordinated by such groups as the Future Homemakers of America, home economics and consumer education teachers and students, in cooperation with school administrators, other school and community groups, and the communication media; and
- WHEREAS: this program on the state level is coordinated by the Future Homemakers of America and National CEW, with the help of the communication media and experts consistent with its central theme and basic purpose; and
- WHEREAS: this program seeks to develop unique avenues for better communication and awareness of consumer concerns of vital interest now, perhaps crucial in the future; and
- WHEREAS: this program seeks to involve young people in leadership roles meaningful to them and their community; and
- WHEREAS: the week of April 10 through April 15, 1978, has been designated "Consumer Education Week" with the central theme "Budgeting Energy;"

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of April 10 through April 15, 1978 to be
