



Proclamation

WHEREAS: cancer kills more children between the ages of one and fifteen than any other disease; and

WHEREAS: the most frequent form of cancer in children is leukemia; and

WHEREAS: the University of Minnesota Hospital has been named a national center for children's cancer research; and

WHEREAS: there is a tremendous need for outside support, both morally and financially, of the leukemia research programs being conducted in Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: the Minnesota Jaycee Women, a group of energetic and deeply concerned women and mothers, have named leukemia research as a two-year priority program for their state organization during which time they will strive to educate themselves, their communities and their state about the fine work being done in this regard and will work to make substantial contributions of support to insure the success of this program;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of September, 1978 to be

LEUKEMIA RESEARCH MONTH

in Minnesota.
