

# Proclamation

- WHEREAS: 1978 marks the twentieth anniversary of Citizens Band Radio, and it has enjoyed unique success and popularity since its inception; and
- WHEREAS: since the Federal Communications Commission established the Class D Citizens Radio Service in 1958, over 13,000,000 station licenses have been issued authorizing the use of 30,000,000 CB transceivers; and
- WHEREAS: the United States is one of the few countries which allows free use of radio for personal communications; and
- WHEREAS: Americans' use of CB for local two-way communications extends from home to vehicles to office and private airplanes; and
- WHEREAS: Citizens Radio today is as much a part of mobile America as the automobile; and
- WHEREAS: there are multiple uses of CB -- friendships are formed, the monotony of tedious journey is broken, communication is established between home and business, emergency help is summoned, disasters are averted, and the citizenry is kept informed; and
- WHEREAS: only the telephone has had such a major impact on the American personal communications scene;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Wednesday, October 4, 1978 as


"CB RECOGNITION DAY"


