WHEREAS: poetry serves the Nation as well, tying generations together through the affirmation of national purpose and the reiteration of national goals; and


WHEREAS: poetry is the common property of all men, enriching the life of the individual as it forms a bond among all who share the human condition;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, October 14, 1978 to be
