



# Proclamation

- WHEREAS: Among the most cherished American ideals are those of personal liberty and maximum individual freedom under the law; and
- WHEREAS: Civil rights legislation of recent years has underscored these ideals and given them specific legal standing; and
- WHEREAS: One important aspect of individual freedom is the right for each person to live where that person chooses, and when and for as long as that person chooses or can afford; and
- WHEREAS: The right to fair housing was codified in Title VIII of the Civil Rights Act of 1968; and
- WHEREAS: Effective exercise of all rights is enhanced by widespread public awareness of those rights;

I, THEREFORE, I, Albert H. Quie, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of April, 1979, to be
