
WHEREAS: The contributions of the outstanding women who participate in this Tribute are of such magnitude that they deserve special recognition and appreciation;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Sunday, February 27, 1983, to be

in Minnesota.


