WHEREAS: Danish Constitution Day annually honors a tradition of free government, which is the heritage of all Americans; and

WHEREAS: Danes in Denmark have uniquely honored America's Independence Day with annual celebrations at Rebild Hills Park; and

WHEREAS: Danes are among the founding pioneers of Minnesota, and remain a vital part of many of our state's communities; and

WHEREAS: The annual Danish Day is not only a visible link for the Danish community, but a bridge of culture and link of understanding for all our citizens; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Monday, June 3, 1985, to be

Danish Day

in Minnesota.
