



Proclamation

WHEREAS: Civic and religious leaders throughout the world, and ordinary citizens of every nation abhor a governmental system which mandates separation of races; and

WHEREAS: The system of racial separation in South Africa has led to violence against citizens of that nation, inequality of opportunity, and oppression; and

WHEREAS: While views differ on how governments, corporations and people can best express their views on apartheid, it is fully appropriate that the subject be widely discussed in public forums; and

WHEREAS: The executive director of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, Dr. Benjamin Hooks, has called for a national day of mourning for the violence in the Republic of South Africa; and

WHEREAS: It has been suggested that Saturday, October 5, 1985, be so designated as a national day of mourning;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim Saturday, October 5, 1985, to be
