WHEREAS: Arnold C. Bauer has distinguished himself in the 1942 Johnson High School class through his contribution to the hockey and golf programs throughout Minnesota; and

WHEREAS: He was a successful member of amateur and professional hockey teams in Minnesota from 1949 to 1959; and

WHEREAS: He has greatly enhanced Minnesota's golf recreation with the designs of Maplewood Country View Golf Course and Chisago Lakes Country Club Golf Course; and

WHEREAS: He has organized the Minnesota State High School Hockey Association as we know it today; and

WHEREAS: He has contributed to the education of Minnesota's citizens through his teaching at North High School in North St. Paul from 1948 to 1964, where he coached golf and hockey; and
