- WHEREAS: The state of Minnesota has created a high quality system of educational opportunities beyond the high school level for its residents, including a diverse array of public and private institutions and access to institutions in neighboring states; and
- WHEREAS: The state of Minnesota is committed to ensuring equal opportunity for all its residents, regardless of their social and economic background, to attend the institution best suited to their needs and abilities; and
- WHEREAS: The state of Minnesota has made educational opportunities beyond high school affordable to its residents by establishing one of the nation's most innovative and comprehensive systems of grants, loans, and work-study opportunities for students; and
- WHEREAS: Minnesota residents need accurate and timely information about financial assistance available to help them pay for their education so that they do not foreclose decisions to continue their education; and
- WHEREAS: The Minnesota Association of Financial Aid Administrators has developed a campaign to inform students and families throughout Minnesota about financial aid programs available and how to apply for them; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the first week of February to be
