

Proclamation

WHEREAS: The disease AIDS is now widely recognized to be the leading public health problem of our time; and

WHEREAS: It has been estimated that 270,000 people will have been diagnosed with AIDS nationwide — and 180,000 of those people will have died — by the end of 1991; and

WHEREAS: Between 1,350 and 1,900 of those AIDS cases will have been diagnosed here in Minnesota — and anywhere from 900 to 1,100 AIDS deaths will occur in our state — before the end of 1990; and

WHEREAS: The unchecked spread of this disease could have a devastating impact on our state and our nation; and

WHEREAS: In the absence of an effective treatment or vaccine, information and education remain our most effective weapons in the battle against this disease — and our most effective means of controlling its spread; and

WHEREAS: Our state has already assumed a leadership role in making use of educational, informational and disease control strategies to help contain the spread of the AIDS virus; and

WHEREAS: During the month of October, 1988 — here in Minnesota and nationwide — interested individuals, groups and government agencies will be participating in efforts to focus public attention on the urgency of the AIDS problem;

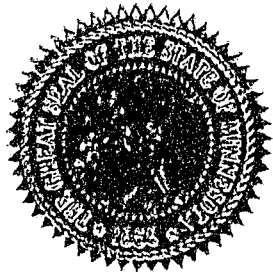
NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the month of October, 1988 to be
