



## Proclamation

WHEREAS: More than 1,200,000 Minnesotans are age 45 or over, and some 589,000 of them are part of the state's civilian labor force; and

WHEREAS: Despite high job qualifications, many of these workers have lost their jobs and have great trouble finding new ones, with the search becoming more difficult as they grow older; and

WHEREAS: The United States government and the State of Minnesota are working to overcome widespread reluctance to hire older job-seekers by making employers aware of each worker judged on the basis of individual ability to do a specific job; and

WHEREAS: The percentage of Minnesotans age 45 and older will grow to 35 percent by the year 2000 while the share of workers under age 25 will fall to 17 percent; and

WHEREAS: Older workers are reliable, safety conscious, have low absenteeism and produce quality work; and


WHEREAS: We need to fully tap the economic potential of older workers;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim the week of May 8-14, 1988 to be

in Minnesota.


