WHEREAS: Patrick G. Lyttle has been employed by the St. Paul Police Department for nine years;
and

WHEREAS: On August 19, 1989, Officer Lyttle and other St. Paul officers responded to a residential fire; and

WHEREAS: The officers were successful in removing several disoriented children from the first floor of the residence; and

WHEREAS: The officers heard a young girl crying for help from the second floor; and

WHEREAS: Officer Lyttle disregarded his own safety and welfare, ventured into the smoke and flames, and rescued an eleven-year-old unconscious female; and

WHEREAS: On March 28, 1990, the Minnesota Chiefs' of Police Association is honoring Officer Lyttle by presenting him with the "Police Officer of the Year" award for 1989;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Rudy Perpich, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim March 28, 1990 to be
