GOVERNOR'S ORDER #7

EXTENDING ADDITIONAL PROTECTION TO PRAIRIE CHICKEN OR PINNATED GROUSE, WHITE BREASTED OR SHARP TAILED GROUSE, IN ALL COUNTIES OF THE STATE WITH THE EXCEPTION OF KITTSOON, ROSEAU, MARSHALL, PENNINGTON, RED LAKE, POLK, NORMAN, CLAY, WILKIN, SWIFT, BIG STONE, AITKIN, PINE AND KANABEC, MORRISON AND TODD, AND THEREIN FOR A PERIOD OF SEVEN DAYS ONLY FROM SEPTEMBER 16 to SEPTEMBER 22, 1929, INCLUSIVE.


WHEREAS, it has been represented to the Commissioner of Game and Fish that prairie chicken or pinnated grouse and white breasted or sharp tailed grouse are in danger of undue depletion in the State of Minnesota, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Game and Fish has presented me with the results of his investigation and has recommended that additional protection be given prairie chicken or pinnated grouse and white breasted or sharp tailed grouse in this State to prevent their undue depletion, and


WHEREAS, I find that there is danger of the undue depletion of prairie chicken or pinnated grouse and white breasted or sharp tailed grouse in this State;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, THEODORE CHRISTIANSON, Governor of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of and pursuant to authority in me vested by Section 5640, General Statutes 1923, do hereby order that no prairie chicken or pinnated grouse and white breasted or sharp tailed grouse be taken in the State of Minnesota during the year 1929, with the exception of Kittson, Roseau, Marshall, Pennington, Red Lake, Polk, Norman, Clay, Wilkin, Swift, Big Stone, Aitkin, Pine, Kanabec, Morrison and Todd counties, and therein for a period of seven days only from September 16 to September 22, 1929, inclusive.

This order shall remain in force until the close of the 1931 regular session of the legislature of the State of Minnesota, unless sooner revoked or modified.
