

CITY ORDINANCE NO. 12
 An Ordinance to make the City of Glencoe subject to the provisions of Chapter 23 of the General Laws of 1893.
 The City Council of the City of Glencoe, of legal and qualified age, do hereby enact and ordain as follows, to-wit: "An act to authorize duties to certain streets, lanes, alleys, avenues and public grounds, and assess the cost thereof on abutting property."
 Sec. 1. That the City of Glencoe be, and hereby be made subject to each and all of the provisions of Chapter 23 of the General Laws of Minnesota for the year 1893, which are set out and compiled as follows, to-wit: "An act to authorize duties to certain streets, lanes, alleys, avenues and public grounds, and assess the cost thereof on abutting property."
 Sec. 2. This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after it shall have been published for one full week in the official newspaper of said city.
 Approved and passed at a regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Glencoe, this 10th day of April, 1899.

That the publisher of said newspaper prior to the date of the publication of said notice, filed with the County Auditor of said McLeod County an affidavit setting fourth the facts required by Section 2, Chapter 33, of the laws of the State of Minnesota, for the year 1893.
