WHEREAS, GOOD WILL DAY is being observed again this year on May 18th, and

WHEREAS, this day commemorates the first international step taken in the interest of universal peace, and

WHEREAS, we are witnessing throughout the world a feverish race among the nations to produce more armaments, more bombs, more airplanes, more battleships and more effective agencies of destruction, while there are people in all countries who are lacking even the ordinary necessities of life;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Elmer A. Benson, Governor of Minnesota, do hereby proclaim




WORLD GOOD WILL DAY
