PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the sustaining love and sacrifice of "Mother" shines as a beacon through this battle haze and strengthens our faith in those rights and liberties which were ours from birth and for which we fight to preserve for our children, and

WHEREAS, by Act of Congress the display of the American Flag is directed on all government buildings on the second Sunday of May in observance of Mother's Day,

NOW, THEREFORE, I, EDWARD J. THYE, Governor of the State of Minnesota, do proclaim

SUNDAY, May 9, 1943

as

MOTHER'S DAY

in Minnesota, and memorialize this day for fitting ceremonies and expressions of endearment to our Mothers, here, and thoughts of reverence for those who have departed, and, I further urge the people of Minnesota to assist the American War Mothers in the sale of their "Mother's Day Carnations".

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this 4th day of May, 1943.
