2 relating to international trade; establishing a  
3 regional international trade service center pilot  
4 project; appropriating money for the project and for

6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

7 Section 1. [REGIONAL INTERNATIONAL TRADE SERVICE CENTER;  
8 PILOT PROJECT.]


9 Subdivision 1. [ESTABLISHMENT.] A regional international  
10 trade service center pilot project is established to provide  
11 assistance in the area of international trade to businesses in  
12 the state. The pilot project shall terminate June 30, 1993.  
13 Overall administration of the center shall be provided by the  
14 board of directors of the Minnesota World Trade Center  
15 Corporation. The commissioner of trade and economic development  
16 shall ensure that no service provided under this section  
17 duplicates a service provided under other law.


18 Subd. 2. [DUTIES.] The regional international trade  
19 service center shall have at least the following duties:

20 (1) to provide timely personalized assistance to businesses  
21 exporting or planning to export goods and services and to  
22 concentrate on providing direct assistance at the place of  
23 business;


24 (2) to establish and maintain access to a current library

This bill was passed in conformity to the rules of each house and the joint rules of the two houses as required by the Constitution of the State of Minnesota.


