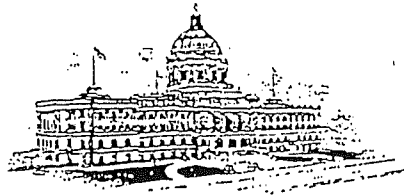

24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:


25 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 1990, section 10A.01,  
26 subdivision 10, is amended to read:

27 Subd. 10. [CAMPAIGN EXPENDITURE.] "Campaign expenditure"  
28 or "expenditure" means a purchase or payment of money or  
29 anything of value, or an advance of credit, made or incurred for  
30 the purpose of influencing the nomination or election of a  
31 candidate or for the purpose of promoting or defeating a ballot  
32 question.


33 An expenditure is considered to be made in the year in  
34 which the goods-or-services-for-which-it-was-made-are-used-or

This bill was passed in conformity to the rules of each house and the joint rules of the two houses as required by the Constitution of the State of Minnesota.


