

School Districts Over 1,000 Enrollment

Description of the Office of the State Auditor

The Office of the State Auditor serves as a watchdog for Minnesota taxpayers by helping to ensure financial integrity, accountability, and cost-effectiveness in local governments throughout the state.

Through financial, compliance, and special audits, the State Auditor oversees and ensures that local government funds are used for the purposes intended by law and that local governments hold themselves to the highest standards of financial accountability.

The State Auditor performs approximately 250 financial and compliance audits per year and has oversight responsibilities for over 4,300 local units of government throughout the state. The office currently maintains five divisions:

Audit Practice - conducts financial and legal compliance audits for local governments;

Government Information - collects and analyzes financial information for cities, towns, counties, and special districts;

Legal/Special Investigations - provides legal analysis and counsel to the Office and responds to outside inquiries about Minnesota local government law; as well as investigates allegations of misfeasance, malfeasance, and nonfeasance in local government.

Pension Oversight - monitors investment, financial, and actuarial reporting for over 700 public pension funds;

Tax Increment Financing (TIF) - promotes compliance and accountability in local governments' use of TIF through financial and compliance audits;

The State Auditor serves on the State Executive Council, State Board of Investment, Land Exchange Board, Public Employee's Retirement Association Board, Minnesota Housing Finance Agency, and the Rural Finance Authority Board.

Executive Summary

Due to the complexity of school district finances and funding formulas, many people do not have an understanding of the finances of their own district, much less how they rank in comparison to other school districts around the state. Starting with this report, the Office of the State Auditor will now report annually on the financial trends of school districts in order to provide some degree of context to school district finances. These reports will be similar to the financial reports of cities, counties, and townships currently published annually by the Auditor's Office.

The report analyzes school district finances over a five-year period. It examines key factors that drive costs in education. It also identifies present revenue and expenditure trends, and explores some key indicators of fiscal health.

The report also provides context to revenues and expenditures by including district rankings on the 2003 per pupil measures and their percent change over the last five years. Citizens and policymakers will have the opportunity to use this information to see how their revenues, expenditures and demographics compare to other school districts in the state.

This is the first installment of a two-part report on school district finances. This report presents data for the years 1999 through 2003 of 168 school districts with enrollment above 1,000 students (includes one district under 1,000, but part of the metro area). The remaining school districts will be studied in a later report.

The 168 school districts accounted for 89 percent of all students and 89 percent of all operating costs in the state in 2003. This report focuses exclusively on these schools because they share similar characteristics such as economies of scale and operations. Since these districts represent almost ninety percent of the students and spending, any fiscal trends could have significant implications at the state level. Citizens and policy makers should be aware of these major trends as further education finance decisions are made.

Major Findings

Flat Overall Enrollment, Increased Revenues and Expenditures

The report found that despite the fact that total enrollment remained virtually flat, school districts saw significant increases in revenues and

expenditures. Between 1999 and 2003, total operating expenditures of all school districts examined in this report grew by 20 percent, almost double the rate of inflation. During the same time period, total revenues increased 25 percent, nearly two and a half times the rate of inflation.¹

Although enrollments remained virtually flat, the number of special population students grew and, in some cases, grew significantly. Minority enrollment increased 21 percent, non-English speaking students increased 60 percent, low-income students increased 3 percent and students receiving special education services increased 6.5 percent.

Not only was the growth in non-English speaking (also referred to as Limited English Proficient or LEP) students dramatic, it was a trend in both metro and Greater Minnesota school districts. Among the 13 districts with an LEP enrollment exceeding ten percent of its total enrollment, 6 were located in the seven-county metro area and 7 were located in Greater Minnesota.

In 2003, approximately 13 percent of the students in the 168 districts examined were receiving special education services. Seventy-one percent of school districts experienced growth in the percentage of children eligible for special education services between 1999 and 2003.

Increased enrollments of special population students are a contributing factor to increased revenue and expenditures because school district funding formulas are driven by the factors that make up special populations. These include, the number of non-English speaking students, the number of minority students, the number of students receiving free and reduced price lunches, the number of special education students, and a district's expenditures on special education.

Slight Increase in Class Size Ratios, Increase in Teacher Salaries

One area that educators have identified as important to student achievement, particularly in the early grades is class size. The number of students per licensed instructional staff has increased slightly over the last five years. The average number of students per staff has increased from 16.3 in 1999 to 16.5 in 2003. Trends also indicate, however, that while the number of teachers is going down, the number of classroom aides is rising.

The average teacher salary rose by 12.5 percent from 1999 to 2003 for the schools included in this report, but inflation grew at a rate of 10.2 percent during this same time period. The demographics of the teaching force changed slightly over this time period. The average years of experience teaching decreased 2.4 percent, the average teacher age decreased 0.2 percent, and the percent of teachers holding master's degrees increased 15 percent.

In total dollars, salary compensation for all school district employees rose 16 percent while the cost of fringe benefits increased 37 percent between 1999 and 2003. The total amount paid in salary may have risen due to an increase in the number of employees, an increase the average salary, or a combination of both. The trend indicates, however, that the cost of benefits is rising at more than twice the rate of salaries.

Revenue Mainly Determined by State Formula, Not Property Wealth of District

The funding of Minnesota school districts is derived from a combination of local, state, and federal revenues. The primary source of revenue is the state, which provided 72 percent of all school district revenue in 2003. Federal aid, property taxes, and other sources of local revenue provided the other 28 percent of revenues.

The primary factor in calculating how much revenue a school district receives is the district's total enrollment. Other factors include the number of non-English speaking students, the number of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, the number of minority students, the district's expenditures on special education, the training and experience of the district's teachers, the geographic density of the district, the age of the school districts buildings, building construction and renovation, and some transitional factors.

Increased Expenditures Driven by Instruction, Special Education Costs

Between 1999 and 2003, average total per pupil operating expenditures increased from \$6,695 to \$8,013, a 20 percent increase. A wide gap exists between the highest and lowest spending districts. Total operating expenditures per pupil ranged from \$5,438 to \$13,886, more than a two-fold difference. For the most part, the state funding formula dictates the level of spending in a district. Those districts that have a higher percentage of special population students receive more money. Statutes dictate that the money is spent only on programs serving those students.

In 2003, instruction (regular instruction, special education, vocational education and support) was by far the largest category of school district expenditures. Instruction costs represent 71.1 percent of all operating expenditures, up slightly from 70.9 percent in 1999. Average instruction costs per pupil increased by 20 percent from 1999 to 2003.

Special education was the fastest growing major program between 1999 and 2003. Average per pupil spending on special education grew 30 percent during this period, increasing from \$1,029 to \$1,334. Overall, the number of special education students grew by 7 percent during the same time period. It should be noted that per pupil expenditures for special education are spread across all enrolled students, not just those receiving special education services.

Average per pupil operating expenditures for administration decreased from 8.3 percent of all operating expenditures in 1999 to 7.7 percent in 2003. In overall dollars, average per pupil operating expenditures for administration increased by 9.7 percent, which is less than the rate of inflation. Among other categories, food service and facilities increased their share of all operating expenditures while pupil support expenditures decreased relative to all operating expenditures.

Financial Indicators Show Growing Fund Balances and Less Cash and Investments on Hand

An analysis of the 1999 to 2003 per pupil undesignated unreserved fund balances in the Operating Funds and the General Fund show increases of 40 and 38 percent respectively. More than two-thirds of the districts showed increases in per pupil undesignated unreserved fund balances of the Operating Funds and General Fund. Overall, the fund balance data seem to indicate that most school districts are spending less than they receive in revenues.

In addition, the number of school districts in Statutory Operating Debt (a negative undesignated unreserved fund balance of the general fund greater than 2.5 percent of its general fund expenditures) decreased by two districts between 1999 and 2003.

Two other financial indicators, the short-term debt and quick ratios provide a measure of the ability of districts to meet current obligations with current cash and investments. The short-term debt ratio is a measure of a school district's short-term indebtedness as a percentage of its available cash and investments. Lower short-term debt ratios may indicate better financial conditions than higher ratios. The quick ratio is a district's cash and investments divided by its current payables, including short-term

debt. A higher quick ratio indicates better ability to meet short-term obligations than a lower quick ratio.

Between 1999 and 2002 (the most recent data available), the average short-term debt ratio increased from .11 to .24. This change in ratio indicates that schools are using a greater amount of short-term debt (generally aid anticipation notes) to fund operations. Among the 68 districts that had at least some short-term debt, the ratios ranged from 1445.78 to 0.07.

The average quick ratio declined from 2.49 in 1999 to 1.39 in 2002. A declining quick ratio indicates schools have less in cash and investments available in which to begin the year. Among the 168 districts examined in this report, the quick ratio ranged from a positive 44.9 to a negative 3.59. A quick ratio of 44.9 means that a district had cash and investments forty-four times greater than its current payables.

While the fund balance indicators seem to contradict the quick and short-term debt ratios, there are two explanations. The first has to do with how state aid payments are provided to the districts. From 1999 to 2001, districts were provided 90 percent of the revenues during the current year and 10 percent the next year. In 2002, the aid distribution formula changed to 83 percent in the current year and 17 percent in the following year. As a result, school districts had a decrease in cash of 7 percent for fiscal year 2002 and the fund balance had an increase in receivables of 7 percent. The 2003 indicators should show an even greater divergence as the aid payments move to an 80/20 shift resulting in even less cash on hand. Also, whereas in the past, districts would receive a large property tax payment in May, the state takeover of general education formula means that they will no longer receive this infusion of cash near the end of the year.

Introduction

This report presents education finance data for the 168 Minnesota school districts with enrollments above 1,000 for the years 1999 through 2003. These school districts accounted for 89 percent of all operating costs and 89 percent of students served by school districts in 2003. This report focuses exclusively on these districts because, as a whole, they share many similar characteristics such as economies of scale and operations. Since these districts represent almost ninety percent of the students and spending, the trends of these districts have much greater implications at the state level.

In addition, this report helps provide context to the revenues and expenditures of individual school districts by providing rankings on the 2003 per pupil measures as well as on their percent change over the five-year period.

The report also examines the factors that drive revenue formulas and expenditures. It also provides five-year trends to help citizens, district officials, and policy makers identify issues that may be of concern.

Demographic Characteristics of School Districts

This report focuses exclusively on the 168 “regular” school districts with enrollments over 1,000. We have excluded charter schools, intermediate districts, and non-operating districts. We have also included one district with an enrollment under 1,000 (Randolph) so that all metro districts are listed. This group of school districts represents just under half of the 341 regular districts.

Enrollment Changes

From 1999 to 2003, total enrollment among the districts examined in this report remained virtually flat.

The group of school districts examined in this report represents 89 percent of the statewide enrollment² for regular school districts. The districts range in size from 47,416 in Minneapolis to 1,003 in Pierz (Randolph is under 1,000 but is included so that all metro districts are represented.)

From 1999 to 2003, total enrollment among the districts examined in this report remained virtually flat. Enrollments actually increased until 2002, and then dropped. The trend among districts with enrollments under 1,000 was a steady decrease.

² While this report uses the terms “enrollments” and “per pupil”, these figures actually reflect what is called Average Daily Membership (ADM) served by the Minnesota Department of Education. See the glossary for a definition of this term.

Table 1 summarizes the trend for the 168 districts in this report and for all 341 regular school districts in the state.

Changes in Special Population Enrollment

Although overall enrollments were flat, we found that:

- Between 1999 and 2003, the number of special population students³ grew, and in some cases, grew significantly.

While overall enrollment declined slightly among the school districts examined in this report, the percentage of students classified in various subgroups of total enrollment increased. Minority enrollment increased 21 percent, non-English speaking students increased 60 percent, low income students increased 3 percent, and students receiving special education services increased 6.5 percent.

Pupils With Limited English Proficiency (LEP)

LEP student enrollment grew by sixty percent between 1999 and 2003.

LEP student enrollment grew by sixty percent between 1999 and 2003. This was far greater than special education or minority enrollment growth. The criteria used to classify LEP students is those students whose primary language is not English, whose English language skills do not allow full classroom participation, whose prior year score on an emerging academic test are below the cutoff score, and who are enrolled in an LEP educational program but have not been enrolled in Minnesota public schools for five or more years.

Among the districts examined in this report, LEP students constituted almost 7 percent of the total enrollment in 2003 compared to 4 percent in 1999. Seventy-three percent of districts experienced growth in the percent

³ Special population students in this report are defined as those that have special status in regards to the education finance formulas. They include those that are eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, minorities, limited English proficient (LEP), and those receiving special education services.

of their student body classified as LEP. Students classified as LEP as a percent of total enrollment ranged from 34 percent in St. Paul to zero in 34 districts.

- Not only was the growth in LEP students dramatic, it was a trend in both metro and Greater Minnesota school districts. Among the 13 districts with an LEP enrollment exceeding ten percent of its total enrollment, 6 were located in the seven-county metro area and 7 were located in Greater Minnesota.

The growth in LEP students indicates that school districts are adjusting to an increasingly diverse student population. The definition of these students and the funding that accompanies the students is structured so that after five years, they are no longer classified as LEP. While funding accompanies LEP enrollment, school districts have had to hire staff specifically to provide services to these students. It is presumable that for many districts, when an influx of LEP students reaches the five-year mark, there will be a reduction in the number of students eligible for LEP status and layoffs may follow. The section on revenue will discuss the role of LEP students and LEP concentrations and its implications for school district funding.

Special Education Students

Local school districts in Minnesota are required to provide special education services to children with disabilities from birth to 21 years of age. For this reason, the enrollment figures listed in this report include pre-kindergarten enrollment, as the district must provide services to these children. Children with disabilities are defined in statute to include children who have a hearing impairment, visual disability, speech or language impairment, physical handicap, other health impairment, mental handicap, emotional/behavioral disorder, specific learning disability, or deaf/blind disability.

In 2003, approximately 13 percent of the students in the 168 districts examined were receiving special education services. The total number of students in this category grew by 7 percent between 1999 and 2003. Special education students as a percent of total enrollment ranged from 21 percent in the Windom school district to 8 percent in the Prior Lake school district. Seventy-one percent of school districts experienced growth in the percentage of children eligible for special education services between 1999 and 2003.

Special education enrollment growth presents funding issues for many school districts because of the structure of special education funding. A school district's special education base revenue is determined by a

revenue-capped reimbursement formula. Special education costs are calculated for a base year, two fiscal years prior to the year of the aid payment. Thus, when the number of special education students or the costs are growing, funding could be less than what is needed. Conversely, when the levels of students receiving special education services or the costs are declining, funding might be greater than what might be needed.

Pupils Eligible for Free or Reduced Lunch

This category is an indicator of the family incomes of the student body. The data is derived from the Application for Education Benefits completed by families at the individual school districts. The percentage is calculated by dividing the number of eligible students by the total October 1 enrollment. The income guidelines for eligibility range from \$16,391 for a family with 1 child to \$56,277 for a family with 8 children.

Those students who qualify for free or reduced-price lunch are classified as special population students because they are the main factor in determining compensatory revenue for school districts. For some schools, compensatory revenue can add as much as fifty percent on to the general education formula revenue.

- **Among the districts with enrollments above 1,000, the percent of students eligible for free or reduced lunch ranged from 67 percent in the Minneapolis school district to 3 percent in the Minnetonka school district.**

The average for this group of school districts was 26 percent in 2003 compared to 25 percent in 1999. Overall, the number of students that qualified for this program grew 4 percent between 1999 and 2003. Sixty-three percent of districts reported an increase in the percentage of students qualifying for free or reduced-price lunches between 1999 and 2003.

Minority Enrollment

Minority enrollment as a percent of total enrollment ranges from 74 percent in Minneapolis to zero percent in Holdingford.

Minority enrollment in Minnesota schools increased significantly between 1999 and 2003. Overall minority enrollment increased 21 percent over the five-year period. With overall enrollment decreasing, particularly among white students, the percent of the total enrollment classified as minority has risen from 16 percent in 1999 to 20 percent in 2003.

Minority enrollment as a percent of total enrollment ranges from 74 percent in Minneapolis to zero percent in Holdingford. Two districts have a higher percentage of minority students than Minneapolis, but both are on Native American Indian Reservations.

The changing demographics of Minnesota school districts are evident throughout the state. Actual minority enrollment grew 23 percent in Greater Minnesota districts compared to 16 percent in the metro area. In fact, of the fifty districts with the highest concentrations of minorities, 27 are in Greater Minnesota.

Table 2 shows the actual enrollment changes by type of special population.

Trends in Class Size

One area that educators have identified as important to student achievement, particularly in the early grades, is class size. In an effort to reduce class size, state law requires that school districts reserve 2 percent of their basic general education revenue for class size reduction in kindergarten and first grades. Once the district achieves a class size of 17:1 in grades kindergarten and one, the district may use the remaining reserved revenue to reduce class size in each subsequent elementary grade.

The average number of students per staff went from 16.3 in 1999 to 16.5 in 2003.⁴

- The trend in pupil-staff ratios shows that class sizes increased slightly between 1999 and 2003.**

Some districts have argued that the requirement that they reserve funds for

⁴ Licensed instructional staff is defined as the full-time equivalent (FTE) licensed instructional staff. It includes regular instruction, vocational education, and special education staff.

class size reduction in the early grades has resulted in the ratio rising in later grades. Between 1999 and 2003, 54 percent of districts saw class sizes increase, 41 percent decreased, and 5 percent remained the same. This trend seems to indicate that for a majority of school districts, there are more students per teacher than 5 years ago.

Trends in Staffing

- Trends indicate that the number of teachers is going down while the number of classroom aides is rising.

While overall enrollment declined by one percent between 1999 and 2003, the number of teachers fell by 3 percent. This was offset by an increase in the number of classroom aides, which rose by 8 percent during this period.

In 1999, there were 45,559 teacher full-time equivalents (FTE's) compared to 44,013 in 2003. Reductions in the number of teachers were reported in 62 percent of the districts examined. Classroom aides increased from 10,707 in 1999 to 11,595 in 2003. Over 68 percent of districts reported an increase in the number of classroom aides during this period.

Teacher Salaries

Teacher salaries grew 12.5 percent between 1999 and 2003.

In 2003, the average teacher salary was \$44,058 compared to \$39,174 in 1999. This represents an increase of 12.5 percent. During this period, inflation grew at a rate of 10.2 percent, meaning that the average teacher salary grew only slightly more than inflation during this period. However, in 31 percent of the districts, the average teacher salary grew less than the rate of inflation.

Several factors affect the average salary of teachers including the overall age of the teaching staff, the number of years of experience, and the educational attainment of the staff. For example, the average teacher salary decreased 6 percent in Columbia Heights between 1999 and 2003. This decrease can be explained in part by the demographic changes of the teaching staff, such as a decrease of 11.1 percent in the average teacher age, a decrease of 32.5 percent in teacher experience, and a decrease of 11.5 percent in the number of teachers with master's degrees. The district also had an increase of 128.6 percent in the number of first year teachers.

In comparison, Elk River, the district with the largest increase in its average teacher salary, had an increase of 5.5 percent in the average teacher age, an increase of 13.6 percent in experience, and increase of 30 percent in the number of teachers holding masters degrees. The number of first year teachers fell by 69.6 percent.

Age, Experience and Educational Attainment of Teachers

From 1999 to 2003, the average age of teachers in Minnesota remained fairly flat at 41.9 years. The average number of years teaching fell slightly during this period going from 15.3 years in 1999 to 14.9 years in 2003. The trends in the experience and age of teachers contributed to the modest increase in salaries during this period.

Over the five-year period, there was a fairly large increase in the number of teachers holding master's degrees. The total number of teachers with master's degrees increased 9 percent while teachers holding only bachelor's degrees fell by 6 percent. The 2003 teaching force among the districts examined in this report shows that 60 percent have bachelor degrees while 40 percent hold master's degrees. This trend will put some pressure on salaries because teacher compensation is based in part by their training and in part by the number of years teaching. Table 3 shows the changes in various teacher demographics.

Total Compensation Trends

An examination of the total dollars allocated for salaries paid to all general fund employees including teachers, administrators, classroom aides, and other professional, administrative and maintenance staff showed an increase of 16 percent between 1999 and 2003, while the total value of benefits paid to these employees increased 37 percent. A lack of data regarding the total number of these employees precluded an examination

of the average increase per employee. Therefore, the level of total salaries paid reflects either a greater number of employees or an increase in the average salary paid, or a combination of both. One should not assume that the average salary increased 16 percent.

Benefits as a percent of salary have increased steadily over this period of time. In 1999, benefits equaled 23 percent of salary compared to 28 percent in 2004.⁵ Health insurance increased 50 percent and grew from 32 percent of the benefits offered in 1999 to 41 percent in 2003.

It is apparent that the cost of benefits is increasing at a much faster rate than that of salaries. This trend has put a damper on salary growth and forced school boards to offer lower salary increases, increase the employee share of health insurance costs through higher premiums and co-pays, or reduce the overall health care benefits.

School District Revenues

The 168 school districts examined in this report received revenues of \$7.4 billion in 2003. This amounted to \$10,041 per pupil.

- **The growth in total revenues per pupil between 1999 and 2003 was 25 percent. This was more than double the 10.2 percent rate of inflation over the five-year period.**

Trends in Revenues

The composition of school district revenues changed considerably over the five-year period this report examined. The largest change was the state's complete takeover of the basic general education formula funding for the FY 2002-03 school year. Prior to FY 03, local levies contributed between 32 and 37 percent of the total general education formula revenues. When the state assumed full funding of the formula, these levies zeroed out.

Table 4 shows the changes in revenue per pupil from 1999 to 2003.



Composition of School District Revenues


The funding of Minnesota school districts is derived from a combination of local, state, and federal revenues. The primary source of revenues is the state, which provided 72 percent of all school district revenue in 2003. Federal aid and other local sources such as property taxes, fees, admission charges, tuition, interest earnings, rent, and gifts provided the other 28 percent of revenues. Figure 1 shows the relative shares of school district funding while Figure 2 shows changes in the composition over five years.

State Revenue Programs

The funding of school districts involves a number of complicated formulas that take into account a wide range of enrollment, geographic, and property wealth factors.⁶ The driving factor behind most of the revenue formulas is school district enrollment. Other factors include the number of non-English speaking students, the number of students eligible for free or reduced-price lunch, the number of minority students, the district's expenditures on special education, the training and experience of the districts teachers, the geographic density of the district, and several other transitional factors.

According to a survey of superintendents conducted for a 2000 report on school district finances by the Minnesota Legislative Auditor, the complexity of the formulas, and the fact that they changed so frequently, made it difficult for them to anticipate total revenues from one year to the next.⁷

Basic General Education Formula Revenue

General education revenue is the primary source of operating funds for school districts and is composed of basic general education revenue, extended time revenue, basic skills revenue, (including compensatory revenue and LEP revenue), training and experience revenue, sparsity revenue, transportation sparsity revenue, operating capital revenue, equity revenue, and transition revenue.

The basic general education formula establishes the minimum level of funding for school districts. General education aid is determined by the formula allowance (\$4,601 in 2003) multiplied by the adjusted marginal cost pupil unit (AMCPU). Under current law, the general education formula allowance is slated to stay at \$4,601 through 2005. With the formula allowance remaining at the same level for the next two years, increased revenue will depend on growth in enrollments or shifts in the composition of a district's enrollment. Basic general education aid accounted for about 88 percent of the general education revenue in 2003.

The following description shows the complexity of the current funding formulas and represents just one of the components of many formulas.

One Kindergarten Pupil	=	.557 pupil units
One Elementary Pupil (grades 1-3)	=	1.115 pupil units

A Preschool Pupil with Disabilities is counted as 1.25 pupil units for the ratio of hours of service with a minimum of .28 ADM and a maximum of 1.25 pupil units.

Weighted Average Daily Membership (WADM)

A WADM is the total of the above weighted pupil unit categories for a school district.

Adjusted Marginal Cost Pupil Units (AMCPU)

An AMCPU is the greater of the total of weighted average daily membership served by the school district multiplied by .77 plus the total of the weighted average daily membership served by the district the prior year multiplied by .23, or the actual current weighted average daily membership served by the district.

Other components of general education revenue from the state include basic skills revenue (compensatory revenue and LEP revenue), sparsity revenue, equity revenue, training and experience revenue, and transition revenue.

The major factors in the general education formulas are as follows:

Compensatory Revenue - based on the number of students eligible for free lunch plus half the students eligible for reduced price lunch multiplied by \$2,512. Compensatory revenue must be used to meet the educational needs of pupils whose progress toward meeting state or local content or performance standards is below the level that is appropriate for learners of their age.

Limited English Proficiency (LEP) Revenue - based on the number of LEP pupil marginal pupil units and LEP concentration pupils. This revenue is designated to provide instruction to students with limited English skills. It includes English-as-a-second language (ESL) programs. Students are limited to a maximum of five years of funding for LEP revenue. Compensatory and LEP revenue together accounted for about 6 percent of general education revenue in 2003.

Sparsity Revenue – has two components, secondary and elementary. The secondary sparsity formula measures the sparsity and isolation of the district and provides revenues to secondary schools that have less than 400 students. Elementary sparsity revenue is available if an elementary school is located 19 or more miles from the next nearest elementary school and has fewer than 20 pupils per grade. Sparsity revenue accounted for about 1.5 percent of general education revenue in 2003.

Operating Capital Revenue – provides \$100 per AMCPU times the district's maintenance cost index. Districts with older buildings receive more revenue because of the maintenance cost index. Operating capital revenue accounted for about 4 percent of general education revenue in 2003.

Equity Revenue – equity revenue is intended to reduce the disparity between the highest and lowest revenue districts on a regional basis. The state is divided into a seven-county metro region and a Greater Minnesota region and equity revenue is calculated separately for districts within each region. Minneapolis, St. Paul and Duluth are not eligible for the program. In each region, districts are ranked according to their total basic, transition, supplemental and referendum revenue. Districts below the 95th percentile in the four categories combined are eligible for equity revenue. Equity revenue accounted for about 0.7 percent of general education revenue in 2003.

Training and Experience Revenue – This program partially compensates school districts that have teachers who have a substantial number of years of service to the school district and higher levels of educational attainment. The program is currently being phased out and is limited to those teachers who taught in the district during the 1996-97 school year and are still teaching in the same school district during the current year. Training and experience revenue accounted for about 0.3 percent of general education revenue in 2003.

Referendum Revenues

The current funding formulas have diminished the importance of property wealth and levies in school funding. We found that:

- **Outside of a few districts, the property wealth of the district has very little correlation to the general fund revenues of the district.**

Due to the level of state funding, equity revenue, referendum revenue caps, and referendum equalization, inequities in tax base do not translate into inequities in school funding. In fact, a statistical analysis of the data

showed that there was only a small correlation between property wealth and the level of revenue for school districts. Differences in referendum revenue may have more to do with the willingness of taxpayers to support referendums than the level of property wealth in the district.

The referendum revenue program, often referred to as the operating referendum levy or excess levy referendum, is a mechanism that allows school districts to obtain voter approval to increase its revenue beyond limits set in statute. The 2001 Legislature greatly reduced the referendum levy beginning in fiscal year 2003. Each district's referendum revenue was reduced by \$415 per pupil unit. At the same time the referendum was reduced, the basic formula allowance for all districts was increased by \$415 per pupil unit.

The Legislature also imposed referendum caps. In 2003, districts could not levy more than 18.2 percent of the formula allowance (\$837 in 2003) or for those districts with authority from 1994 that were above the cap – their capped authority increased by 16.2 percent. These caps ensure that property wealth can only enhance educational opportunities in school districts by a maximum of \$837 per pupil.

In addition, the state provides equalization aid to ensure that the same tax rates in districts of different property wealth generate the same amount of revenue. Thus, districts with higher property wealth will pay a greater percentage of the levy with property taxes than a district with low property wealth.

- **Overall, the changes in referendum levies have resulted in the per pupil revenues derived from property taxes shrinking from \$2,379 in 2002 to \$1,235 in 2003. This represents a decrease of 47 percent.**

Special Education Revenues

Districts receive revenue to recognize a portion of the additional costs of providing required services to students with a disability. Special education costs are calculated for a base year, two fiscal years prior to the year of the aid payment. A district's revenue is the amount obtained by summing the special education reimbursements.

Because the aid is calculated based on the costs incurred two years prior, districts with increasing special education enrollments or costs must use a greater amount of other general fund revenues to provide services in the interim. In 2003, special education revenues represented an amount that was about 10 percent of the total of general education revenue.

There was a more than two-fold difference in total operating expenditures between the top and bottom spending districts.


School District Expenditures

Expenditures by Program

School district operating expenditures are composed of 11 different programs.⁸ School districts on average spent a total of \$8,013 per pupil on these various programs. Among individual school districts, total operating expenditures per pupil ranged from \$5,438 to \$13,886, more than a two-fold difference. Two of the top three spending districts are within Native American Indian Reservations and receive special federal funding.

For the purpose of this analysis, we have grouped the eleven categories into 5 groups: administration, instruction, pupil support, facilities, and food service. The largest area of program spending is instruction, which represented 71 percent of all operating expenditures in 2003. This category includes regular instruction, vocational instruction, special education, and instructional support such as classroom aides. Figure 3 illustrates the relative share of program expenditures.

Administration represented a smaller share of school district spending in 2003 than in 1999.

Since 1999, there has been a slight shift in the allocation of school district spending. Two categories accounted for a smaller percentage of total operating expenditures: administration and pupil support. The share of administration expenditures decreased from 8.3 percent in 1999 to 7.7 percent in 2003. Pupil support expenditures decreased from 8.9 percent in 1999 to 8.8 percent in 2003.

Three categories of expenditures increased their shares of total operating expenditures. Instruction increased from 70.9 percent to 71.1 percent between 1999 and 2003. Spending on facilities, which includes the operation and maintenance of buildings and insurance, increased from 7.7 percent in 1999 to 8.12 percent in 2003

Table 5 illustrates the changes in program expenditures.



Within the category of instruction expenditures, regular instruction accounts for a little more than two-thirds of the total. Regular instruction includes classroom instruction as well as spending for students with limited English proficiency, students needing help with basic skills, and gifted and talented students.

Regular Instruction accounted for two-thirds of 2003 instructional expenditures.

As figure 4 shows, special education accounts for 23 percent of instructional spending. The remaining non-regular instructional spending went for instructional support services and vocational education.

Growth in Spending

We found that for the most part, the state funding formula dictates the level of spending in a district. Those districts that have a higher percentage of special population students receive more money. Statutes dictate that the money is spent on the programs serving these students. Districts must show that they are spending the resources on these services. Most money is spent and not added to fund balances.

Between 1999 and 2003, total operating expenditures of Minnesota school districts increased 20 percent, growing from \$5.0 billion to \$5.9 billion. On a per pupil basis, total operating expenditures grew from \$6,695 to \$8,013, also a 20 percent increase. This was almost double the rate of inflation and during a period of flat to declining enrollments.

The fastest growing major program between 1999 and 2003 was special education. Per pupil spending on special education grew 30 percent during this period, increasing from \$1,029 to \$1,334 (this represents the total spending spread over all students, not just those receiving special

education services). The number of special education students grew 7 percent over this period.

Several of the other programs grew by more than 18 percent including regular instruction, pupil support, operations and maintenance, transportation and food service.

District and school administration expenditures per pupil grew at a modest 8 percent, increasing from \$357 in 1999 to \$386 in 2003. Interestingly, per pupil spending on administration stayed the same from 2001 to 2003. Per pupil spending on vocational instruction showed the only decrease among all programs.

Table 6 illustrates the change in per pupil spending among various categories.

Variation Among Districts

While average expenditures per pupil helps identify trends, there is great variation among the individual districts. Wide variation exists in both the level of per pupil spending and the rate of growth. For example, in the case of 2003 total operating expenditures per pupil, expenditures ranged from \$5,438 to \$13,886 with an average of \$8,013. Rates of change ranged from negative 3 percent to positive 32 percent.

As was stated in the revenue section, property wealth accounts for very little of the variation among districts in the amount they spend on education. If the goal was to limit the importance of property wealth in education funding, Minnesota has accomplished it. Based on a statistical analysis of property wealth per pupil, less than three percent of the variation in spending among school districts can be attributed to property wealth.

There are many factors that can affect district expenditures in any given year or period of time. Significant growth or declines in special populations can affect the funding and spending of school districts. Because special populations receive categorical funding, the districts must spend the money on the specified purpose.

Districts that experience declining enrollment often are not able to reduce expenditures at the same rate. This results in an increasing per pupil expenditure. In contrast, because funding is tied to enrollment, the total revenues of the districts go down. This results in a declining amount of total revenues for the district. It may take several years for districts to adjust their level of spending to their lower revenue amounts.

Catastrophic events such as tornadoes or floods that damage facilities may cause that district to receive special state or federal aid for rebuilding facilities, or for providing interim classrooms. These districts will show very high expenditures for a period of time and then return to more normal expenditures.

Financial Indicators

This section examines four indicators that can be used to help assess a school district's financial health. The first indicator examined was fund balance. Fund balances can help indicate whether school district revenue and expenditures are balanced over a period of time, and how well the district can meet obligations over the course of the year.

The other indicators were the short-term debt and quick ratio. The short-term debt ratio is a measure of a school district's short-term indebtedness

in relation to its available cash and investments. Lower short-term debt ratios may indicate better financial conditions than higher ratios. The quick ratio is a district's cash and investments divided by its current payables, including short-term debt. A higher quick ratio indicates better ability to meet short-term obligations than a lower quick ratio. These ratios help assess the districts ability to meet current obligation with their cash and investments on hand. The fund balance data measures all financial resources whereas the short-term debt and quick ratios measure only cash and investments on hand.

Fund Balances

Unreserved undesignated fund balances can be an important indicator of the overall fiscal health of a district. They can be looked at in two ways: whether they are increasing or decreasing on a per pupil basis, and the percent of expenditures they represent.

Districts that have declining fund balances or negative fund balances are spending more than the revenues they receive. A downward trend over a five-year period could indicate that the district will have to adjust spending to keep their revenues and expenditures in balance.

From 1999 to 2003, the median per pupil fund balance of the school districts examined in this report grew from \$518 to \$727, an increase of 40 percent in unadjusted per pupil dollars. Among the districts, 69 percent showed increases and 31 percent showed decreases over the five-year period.

Fourteen districts posted a negative unreserved undesignated fund balance in 2003 compared to 22 in 1999.

Unreserved General Fund Balance

From 1999 to 2003, the median per pupil undesignated unreserved fund balances of the general fund grew from \$479 to \$661, an increase of 38 percent. Among the districts, 66 percent showed an increase over this period, 34 percent showed a decrease.

The number of school districts having a negative unreserved fund balance increased from zero in 1999 to 17 in 2003. Interestingly, there has been no real overall trend as the number of districts with negative fund balances went from 28 in 2000, to 15 in 2001, to 24 in 2002, to 17 in 2003.

An examination of the median undesignated unreserved general fund balances as a percent of general fund expenditures showed that the percentage increased from 7.6 percent in 1999 to 9.3 percent in 2003.

Statutory Operating Debt

A district that reports a negative general fund undesignated unreserved fund balance in excess of 2.5 percent of its general fund expenditures is considered to be in statutory operating debt (SOD). Districts that are in SOD are required to submit a plan to the Commissioner of Education explaining how they will eliminate the deficit.

In 2003, 12 districts were in SOD. This was 2 less than in 2002, and three less than the number reported in 2000 and 2001.

Short-term Debt and Quick Ratio

The short-term debt ratio and quick ratio are two more financial indicators that can be used to assess the fiscal health of school districts. The short-term debt ratio is a measure of a school district's short-term indebtedness in relation to its available cash and investments. Lower short-term debt ratios may indicate better financial conditions than higher ratios. The average short-term debt ratio more than doubled between 1999 and 2002 (the most current year available for this data). In 1999 the average short-term debt ratio was .11 compared to .24 in 2002. This change in ratio indicates that, on average, schools are using a greater amount of short-term debt (generally aid anticipation notes) to fund operations

The variation in the short-term debt ratio was great. Almost 60 percent of the districts had a ratio of zero indicating that they had no short-term debt. Among the districts that did have short-term debt, the ratios ranged from 1445.78 to 0.07. This means that the district with the highest ratio has short-term debt 1,400 times greater than its cash and investments on hand. Of the districts that have at least some short-term debt, the one with the lowest ratio had short-term debt of just .07 times its cash and investments on hand.

The quick ratio is a district's cash and investments divided by its current payables, including short-term debt. This quick ratio measure includes only the General and Special Revenue Funds. A higher quick ratio indicates better ability to meet short-term obligations than a lower quick ratio. The quick ratio declined from 2.49 in 1999 to 1.39 in 2002. In 2002, the median quick ratio was 1.50 as compared to 2.89 in 1999

Among districts, the quick ratios in 2002 varied from a positive 44.9 to a negative 3.59. The quick ratio of 44.9 means that the district had cash and

investments that was forty-four times greater than its current payables. The negative 3.59 ratio indicates the district has payables of more than three and a half times its cash and investments on hand.

A declining quick ratio indicates schools have less in cash and investments available in which to begin the year. While an increase in the fund balance indicates schools may have increased other resources to compensate for the decrease in the cash and investments. The short-term debt ratio increased as more schools required short-term borrowing to meet current obligations as a result of the decrease in the cash and investments. The trends, while opposite, show that although cash and investments on hand are decreasing, other financial resources available to the districts are generally sufficient to cover expenses over the course of the year.

Explanation of Contradictory Indicators

While the fund balance indicators seem to contradict the quick and short-term debt ratios, there are two explanations. The first has to do with how state aid payments are provided to the districts. From 1999 to 2001, districts were provided 90 percent of the revenues during the current year and 10 percent the next year. In 2002, the aid distribution formula changed to 83 percent in the current year and 17 percent in the following year. As a result, school districts had a decrease in cash of 7 percent for fiscal year 2002 and the fund balance had an increase in receivables of 7 percent. The 2003 indicators should show an even greater divergence as the aid payments move to an 80/20 shift resulting in even less cash on hand. Also, whereas in the past, districts would receive a large property tax payment in May, the state takeover of general education formula means that they will no longer receive this infusion of cash near the end of the year.

GLOSSARY

Average Daily Membership (ADM): The sum for all pupils of the number of days in the district's school year each pupil is enrolled, divided by the number of days the schools are in session.

Adjusted Marginal Cost Pupil Units (AMCPU): The counts of pupils used for most school funding formulas. The count is adjusted (meaning students served), marginal (the greater of the current year's count, or 77 percent of current year's count and 23 percent of the previous year's count), and weighted by grade level (pupil units).

Adjusted Net Tax Capacity (ANTC): The property value used for assessing most school taxes. ANTC is determined by equalizing differences in tax capacities by property type in different counties. This equalization process compares market values to actual sales and is intended to neutralize the effect of differing assessment practices. Also, the ANTC reflects the application of the classification rates to the market value of the property.

District and School Administration: Expenditures for the school board and for the office of the superintendent, principals, and any other line administrators who supervise staff.

District Support Services: Expenditures for central office administration and central office operations not included in district and school administration. Includes expenditures for business services, data processing, legal services, personnel office, printing, and the school census.

Food Service: Expenditures for the preparation and serving of meals and snacks to students.

Instructional Support Services: Expenditures for activities intended to help teachers provide instruction, not including expenditures for principals or superintendents. Includes expenditures for assistant principals, curriculum development, libraries, media centers, audiovisual support, staff development, and computer-assisted instruction.

Operations and Maintenance: Expenditures for operation, maintenance, and repair of the district's buildings, grounds, and equipment. Includes expenditures for custodians, fuel for buildings, electricity, telephones, and repairs.

Other Operating Programs: Expenditures for general fund operating programs necessary to a district's operations but not assignable to other programs. These can include federally funded community education services for students, property and liability premiums, principal and interest on noncapital obligations, and nonrecurring costs such as judgments and liens.

Pupil Support Services: Expenditures for all non-instructional services provided to students, not including transportation and food. Includes expenditures for counseling, guidance, health services, psychological services, and attendance and social work services.

Pupil Transportation: Expenditures for transportation of students, including salaries, contracted services, fuel for buses, and other expenditures.

Regular Instruction: Expenditures for elementary and secondary classroom instruction, not including vocational instruction and exceptional instruction. Includes salaries of teachers, classroom aides, coaches, and expenditures for classroom supplies and textbooks.

Special Education: Expenditures for instruction of students who, because of atypical characteristics or conditions, are provided educational programs that are different from regular instructional programs. Includes expenditures for special instruction of students who are emotionally or psychologically disabled, or mentally retarded; for students with physical, hearing speech, and visual impairments; and for students with special learning and behavior problems.

Vocational Instruction: Expenditures in secondary schools for instruction that is related to job skills and career exploration. Includes expenditures for home economics, as well as industrial, business, agriculture, and distributive education.
