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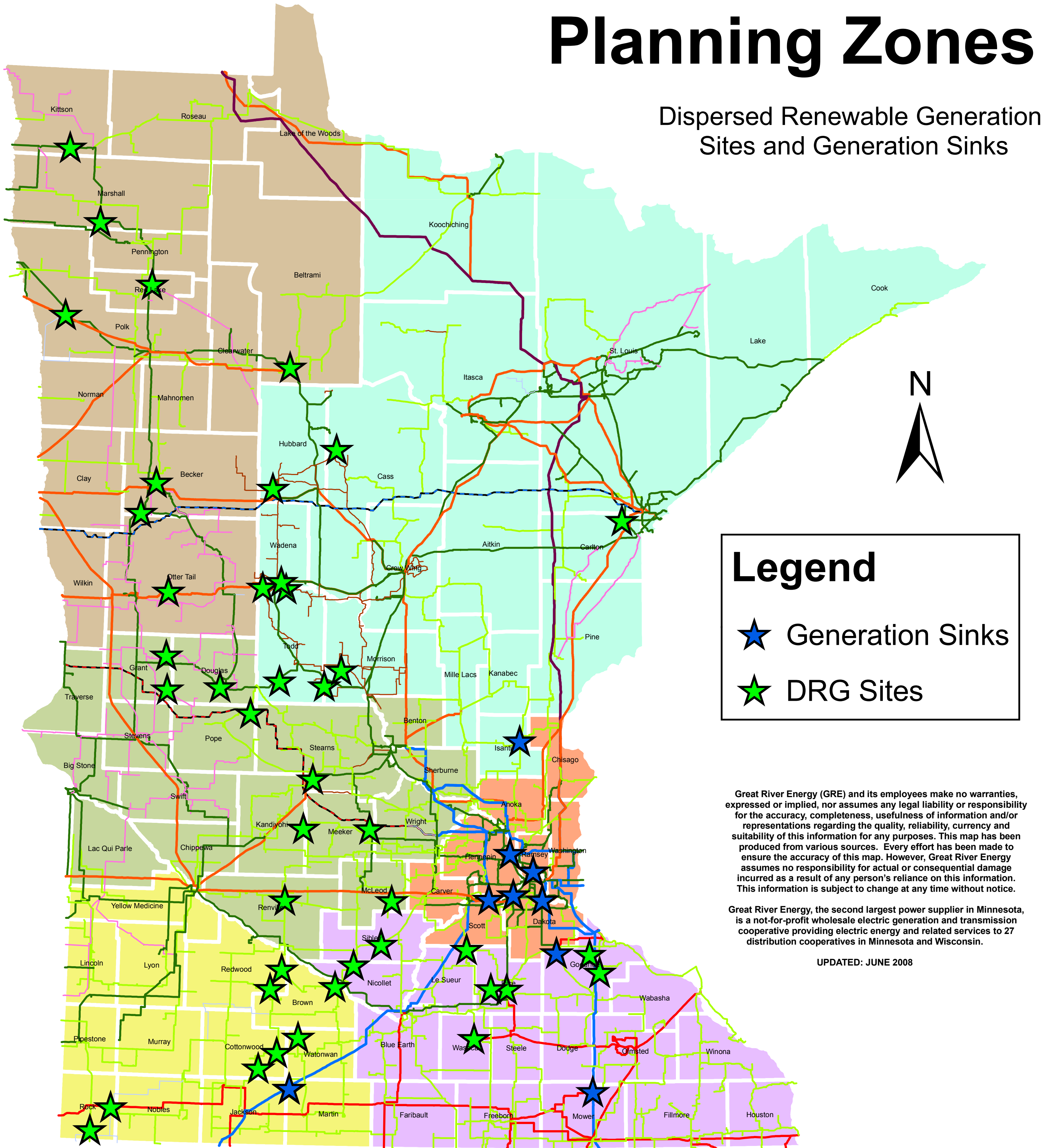

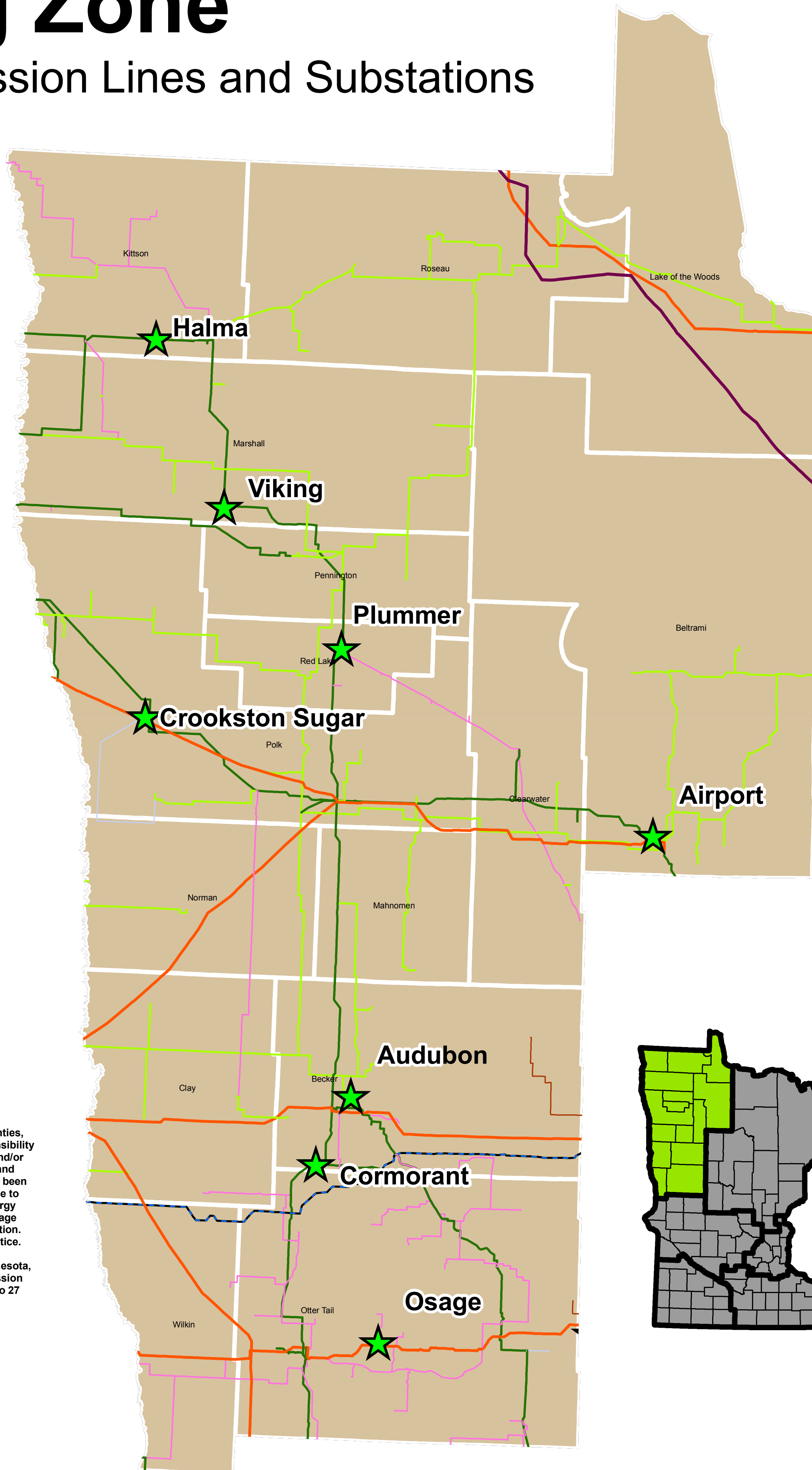

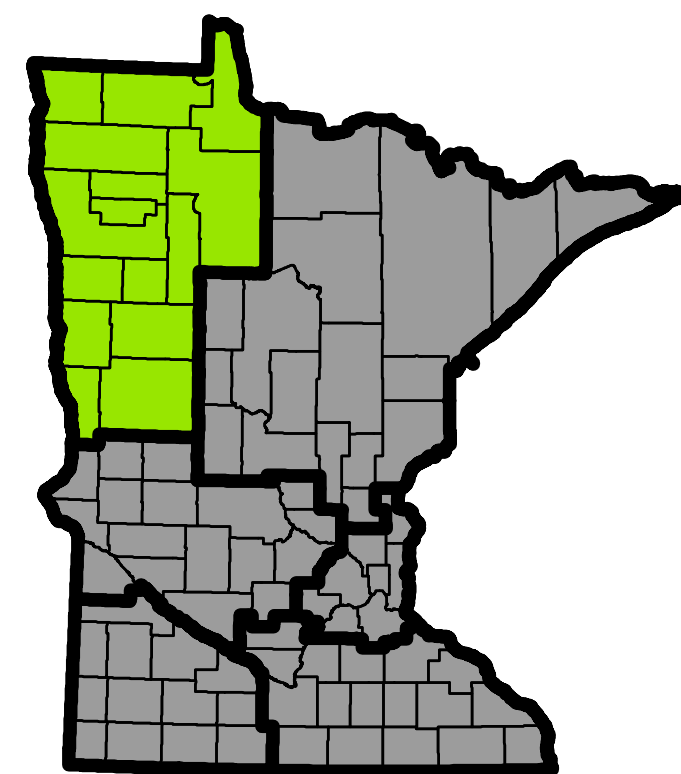

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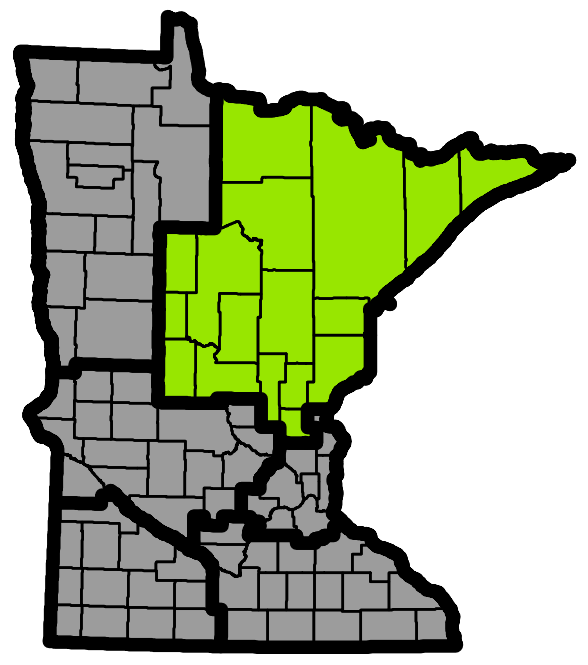
Northeast Minnesota Planning Zone

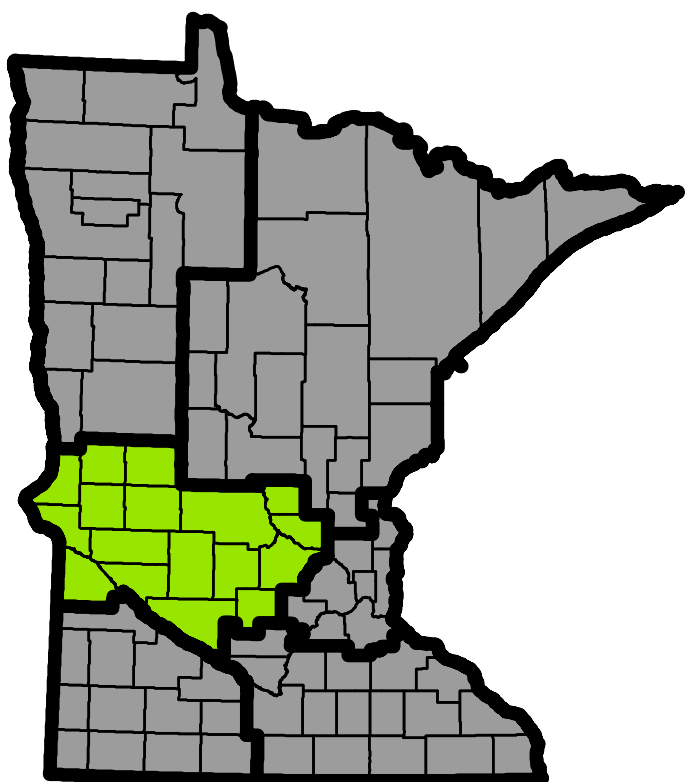
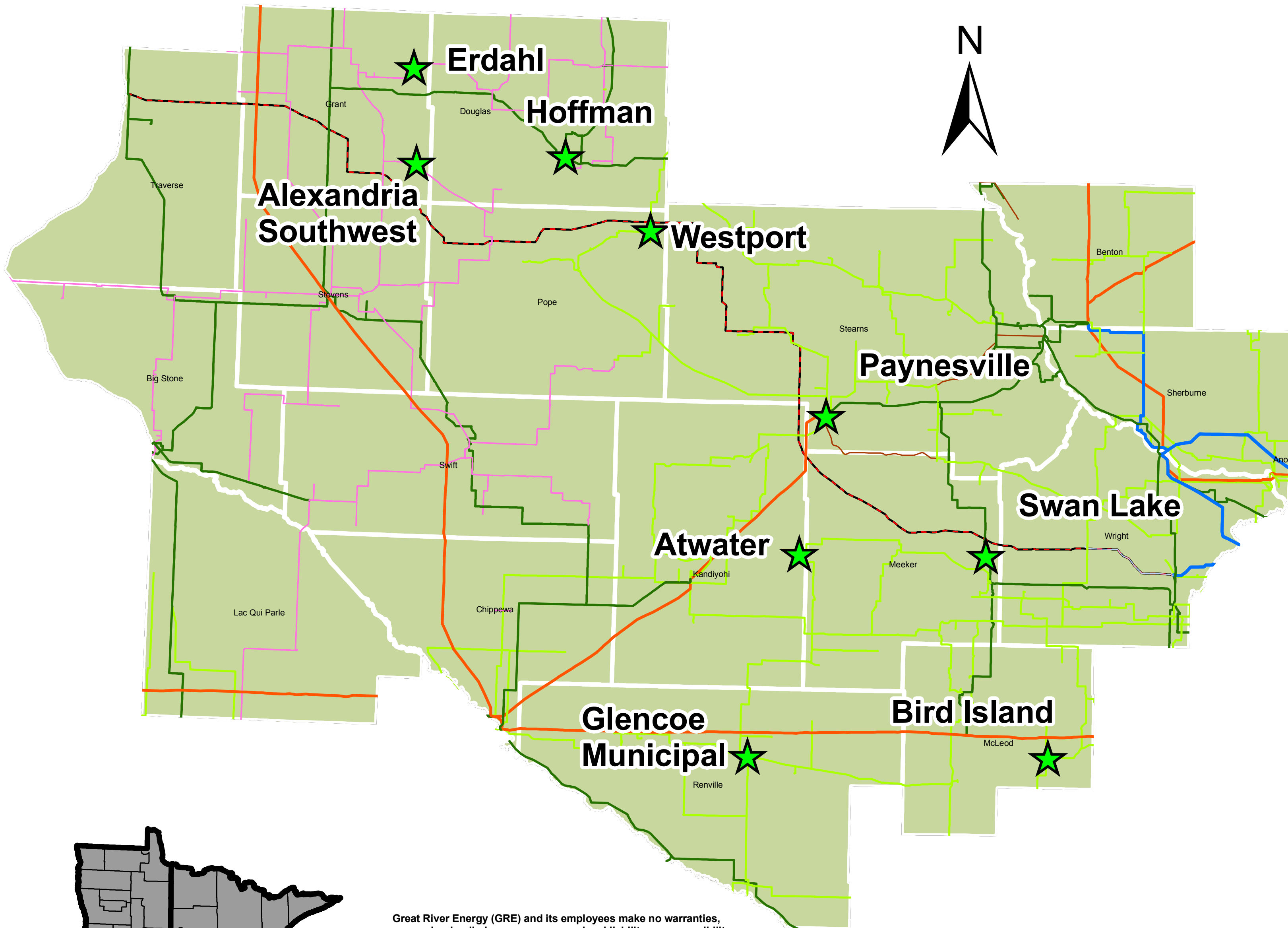


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West Central Minnesota Planning Zone

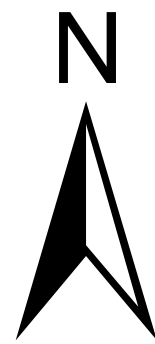
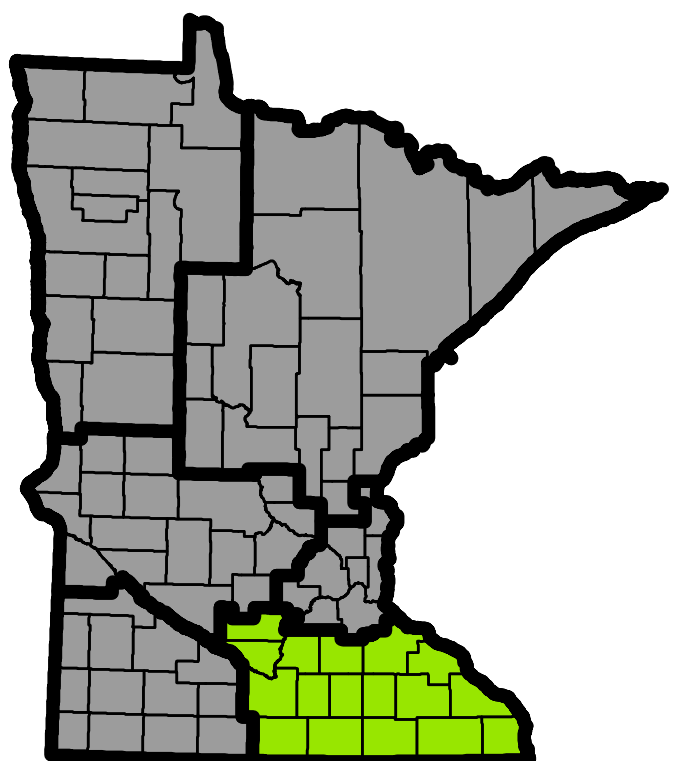
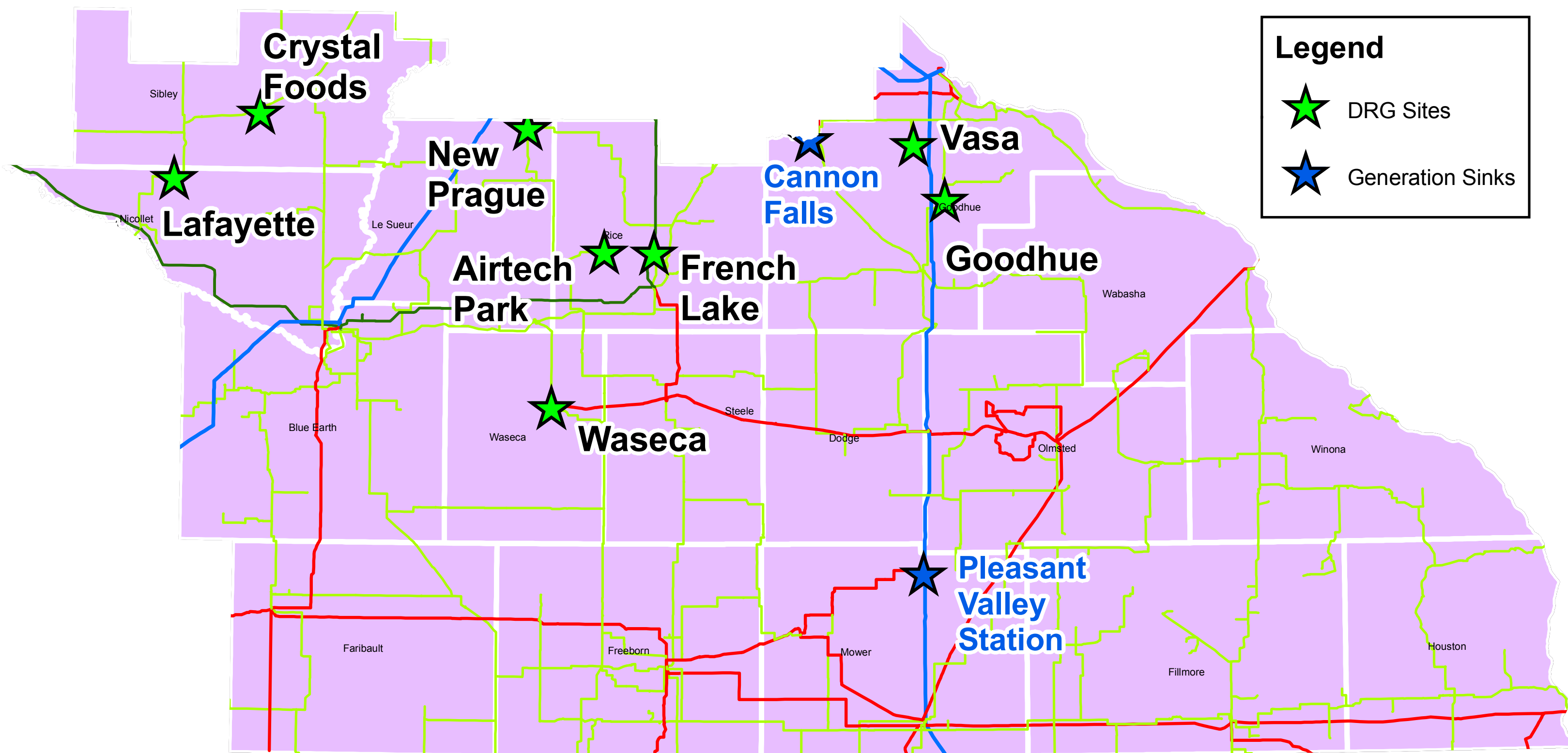
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Southeast Minnesota Planning Zone
