Laws of 2003, 1st Special Session, Chapter 1, Article 1, Section 3 requires the Commissioner of Finance to report to the chairs of the State Government Finance Divisions any personnel costs incurred on behalf of the Governor's Office that were supported by appropriations to the other agencies. The information for FY 04 is outlined below for your review and submission to the chairs.

An interagency agreement was in place during FY 04 between the Governor's Office and the Department of Transportation to fund 50% of the personnel costs incurred by Jeff Davidman amounting to \$35,113.

Interagency agreements were in place to fund all of the FY 04 personnel costs amounting to \$152,453 for employees of the Washington Office.

Funding for the Washington Office was provided from 11 agencies as follows.

The Department of Administration provided the plant management responsibilities at the Governor's Residence by providing one full-time groundskeeper/general maintenance worker at a cost of \$40,205/ year.

One employee of the Department of Administration provided IT and LAN support services and maintenance of an integrated data base system for the Governor's Office.
