Note: In 1997, \$2.7 million of General Funds conditioned on an equal non-state match was appropriated to City of St. Paul for developing a riverwalk at Harriet Island Regional Park. The 1997 Env. Trust Fund appropriation to the Metropolitan Council in this work program is for park roads, parking lots and lighting at Harriet Island Regional Park.

This appropriation may be used for the purchase of homes only if the purchases are expressly included in the work program approved by the legislative commission on Minnesota resources.

This project must be completed and final products delivered by December 31, 1997, and the appropriation is available until that date. (Amended in 1997 to extend appropriation to June 30, 1999)

1995 Env. Trust Fund Appropriation

M. L. 1995, Chap. 220, Sec. 20 (b) and (c) Metropolitan Regional Parks and Trails Acquisition \$ 1,120,000 This appropriation is to the commissioner of natural resources for payment to the metropolitan council for subgrants to acquire parks and trails consistent with the metropolitan council regional recreation open space capital improvement plan.

This appropriation may be used for the purchase of homes only if the purchases are expressly included in the work program approved by the legislative commission on Minnesota resources.

1996 G. O. Bond Appropriation

This appropriation may be used for for the purchase of homes only if the purchases are expressly included in the work program approved by the legislative commission on Minnesota resources.

1997 Environmental Trust Fund Appropriation

M.L. 1997, Chap. 216, Sec. 15, Subd. 4(b), METROPOLITAN REGIONAL PARK SYSTEM \$3,500,000

This appropriation is from the trust fund for payment by the commissioner of natural resources to the metropolitan council for subgrants for acquisition, development and rehabilitation in the metropolitan regional park system consistent with the metropolitan council regional recreation open space capital improvement program. This appropriation may be used for the purchase of homes only if the purchases are expressly included in the work program approved by the legislative commission on Minnesota resources. The metropolitan council shall collect and digitize all local, regional, state and federal parks and all off road trails with connecting on-road routes for the Metropolitan area and produce a printed map. This project must be completed and final products delivered by June 30, 2000 and the appropriation is available until that date.

1998 Capital Appropriation

M.L. 1998, Chap. 404, Sec. 7, Subd. 7. Metro Regional Park Acquisition and Betterment \$14,400,000

(a) \$9,000,000 is for payment to the metroplitan council. The commissioner shall pay the amount on a reimbursement basis to the metropolitan council upon receipt of a certified copy of a council resolution requesting payment. The appropriation must be used to pay the cost of rehabilitation, acquisition and development by the council and local government units of regional recreational open-space lands in accordance with the council's policy plan as provided in Minnesota Statutes section 473.315. This appropriation must not be used for research, planning, administration, or tax equivalency payments. This appropriation may be used for the purchase of homes only if the purchases are are included in the workprogram required by law and they are expdressly approved by the legislative commission on Minnesota resources.

\$840,000 of this appropriation may be used by the metropolitan council to reimburse Washington county for acquiring St. Croix Bluffs regional park in 1997.

(b) \$3,900,000 of this appropriation is for a grant to the metropolitan council to prepare a site for, design, construct, furnish, and equip, including utility infrastructure, the Como Park Education Resource Center, Phase One. The grant is contingent upon the city of St. Paul maintianign Como Park zoo as a free attraction for the life of the bonds. The city may however, charge a fee for use of the Como Park golf course and the conservatory and for special event facility rentals at the park, including the zoo and conservatory.

The center must report to the chair of the senate environment and agriculture budget division, the chair of the house environment and agriculture finance committee, and the chairs of the senate and house environment and natural resources policy committees as soon as the center has secured half of the total project costs from nonstate sources.

(c) \$1,500,000 is for a grant to the metropolitan council for capital expenditures necessary to carry out the Harriet Island Redevelopment in accordance with the Lilydale/Harriet Island master plan. This appropriation is not available until the commissioner determines that an equal amount has been committed from nonstate sources.

1998 Capital Appropriation (continued)

1998 Capital Appropriation for Metro. Regional Trails

M.L. 1998, Chap. 404, Sec. 7, Subd. 23. Metro Regional Trails \$5,000,000

For grants to the metropolitan council for acquisition and development of a capital nature of trail connections in the metropolitan area as specified in this subdivision. The purpose of the grants is to improve trails in the metropolitan park and open space system and connect them with existing state and regional trails. Priority shall be given to matching funds for an ISTEA grant.

The funds shall be allocated by the council as follows:

(1) \$1,050,000 is allocated to Ramsey county as follows:

(i) \$400,000 to complete six miles of trails between the Burlington Northern Regional Trail and Bald Eagle-Otter Lake Regional Park;

(ii) \$150,000 to complete a one-mile connection between Birch Lake and the Tamarack Lake segment of Bald Eagle-Otter Lake Regional Park;

(iii) \$500,000 to acquire real property and design and construct or renovate recreation facilities along the Mississippi River in cooperation with the city of St. Paul;

(2) \$1,050,000 is allocated to the city of St. Paul as follows:

(i) \$250,000 to construct a bridge over Lexington Parkway in Como Regional Park; and

(ii) \$800,000 to enhance amenities for the trailhead at the Lilydale-Harriet Island Regional Park pavilion;

(3) \$1,400,000 is allocated to Anoka County as follows:

(i) \$1,100,000 to construct a pedestrian tunnel under Highway 65 on the Rice Creek West Regional Trail in the city of Fridley; and

(ii) \$300,000 to construct a pedestrian bridge on the Mississippi River Regional Trail crossing over Mississippi Street in the city of Fridley; and

(4) \$1,500,000 is allocated to the suburban Hennepin regional park district as follows:

(i) \$1,000,000 to connect North Hennepin Regional Trail to Luce Line State Trail and Medicine Lake; and

(ii) \$500,000 is for the cost of development and acquisition of the Southwest regional trail in the city

of St. Louis Park. The trail must connect the Minneapolis regional trail system at Cedar Lake park to the Hennepin parks regional trail system at the Hopkins trail head.

1999 Environmental Trust Fund Appropriations

M.L. 1999, Chap. 231, Sec. 16, Subd. 4(I), Metropolitan Regional Parks Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Development \$2,000,000

\$1,000,000 the first year and \$1,000,000 the second year are from the trust fund to the metropolitan council for subgrants for acquisition, development, and rehabilitation in the metropolitan regional park system, consistent with the metropolitan council regional recreation open space capital improvement plan. This appropriation may be used for the purchase of homes only if the purchases are expressly included in the work program approved by the legislative commission on Minnesota resources. The metropolitan council shall collect and digitize all local, regional, state, and federal parks and all off-road trails with connecting on-road routes for the metropolitan area and produce a printed map that is available to the public. This appropriation is available until June 30, 2002, at which time the project must be completed and final products delivered, unless an earlier date is specified in the work program.

These projects were the highest priority projects of the Metropolitan Council's 1998-99 regional parks capital improvement program (CIP). Appropriations for the Como Park Education Resource Center (\$3.9 million) and Harriet Island redevelopment (\$1.5 million) are passed through the Metro. Council to the City of St. Paul. \$5 million for regional trail connections are also passed through the Metro. Council to regional park agencies.

With regard to the 1997 and 1999 rider language calling for a GIS map of parks and connecting trails, the Metropolitan Council has collected data from municipal governments (cities, counties, townships) of off-road trails throughout the Metropolitan Area. The boundaries of all local, regional, state and federal parks in half of the Metropolitan Area has also been collected under a cooperative effort with the University of Minnesota. The data is being digitized by the Lawrence Group. The off-road bike trails and park boundaries will be published in the 2000 King's Twin Cities Metropolitan Street Atlas in September 1999. On-road bike route data from the MN Dept. of Transportation's bike suitability mapping efforts will be added in late 1999 and early 2000 along with the remainder of park boundaries. Consequently, the requested map of all off-road bike trails with connecting on-road trails and park boundaries will be published in the 2001 King's Twin Cities Metropolitan Street Atlas in Consequently, the requested map of all off-road bike trails with connecting on-road trails and park boundaries will be published in the 2000.

The Metropolitan Council used its own park bond defeasance funds to finance this effort. However, for 2001, a request will be proposed for funds to maintain and update the GIS database on an ongoing basis in cooperation with the MN Dept. of Natural Resources and the MN Dept. of Transportation.

Much of the land listed above abutts or is adjacent to the recently acquire 81 acres (Michaud 1995). With the acquisition of parcels 27025-2575, 2505-2580, and 27026-3200 for regional park purposes, the County would have control of much of the access to Mooers Lake on its south edge.

Acquisition of parcels 27036-2950, 27036-2830, 27036-2800 and 27036-2900 would secure land south of the Michaud property. This would also provide the County an opportunity to work witht the MNDNR and J. L. Shiely Company in establishing a restoration plan for the properties that have been mined for sand and gravel.

Without this property, development of the park would be significantly hampered. The cost of acquiring this property will increase over time, especially if development is allowed to occur. Development will likely require negotiation with multiple owners for acquisition in the future, if we do not purchase the undeveloped land from a single willing seller at this time. The area identified for acquisition (see map) includes a portion of the future park that would function as a large group picnic area and wildlife habitat.

SUMMARY OF COMMITTEE DISCUSSION:

The Community Development Committee met on July 21 to discuss this issue. They reviewed maps of the Bloomington parcel which illustrated why the parcel could not be subdivided to avoid purchasing a home. The Committee concurred with the Metropolitan Parks and Open Space Commission's findings and unanimously approved the following recommendation:

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Metropolitan Council:

- Authorize an amendment increasing Grant SG-95-83 \$55,000 from 1991 Metro. Council bonds 1: for a new total of \$200,000 to acquire 8.6 acres in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

ISSUE: Hennepin Parks and the City of Bloomington have submitted the following requests for residential inholding acquisition grants:

A \$ 55,000 increase to grant SG-95-83 for an 8.6 acre parcel in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve A \$153,000 grant to acquire 7300 Marth Road in the Corridor Park section of Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve.

\$ 208,000 TOTAL GRANT REQUESTS

The acquisitions include the purchase of homes. They must be approved by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCMR) as well as the Metropolitan Council as a condition of the 1995 Environmental Trust Fund appropriation used to partially finance them.

POLICY IMPLICATIONS: The lands acquired with these funds are consistent with Metropolitan Council park/trail acquisition funding policies 3 and 4 respectively. Those policies insure that land acquired is essential to protect the natural resources that define a park or trail and make it usable as planned. The Commission found that the grant increase for the Lake Rebecca parcel was reasonable to meet up-to-date appraisals on the land. The Commission found that the Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lake parcel could not be subdivided to avoid purchasing a home. A trail planned to link this portion of the park reserve with other portions requires this parcel to be acquired.

FUNDING IMPLICATIONS: The grant increase and the new grant will be financed with a combination of 1995 Environmental Trust Funds and Metropolitan Council bonds allocated for inholding acquisitions. Approval of the grant increase and the new grant will leave \$9,559 left for other inholding acquisitions.

PREVIOUS ACTIONS: The Council authorized a \$145,000 grant and the LCMR approved use of 1995 Environmental Trust Funds to purchase the Lake Rebecca parcel in 1995. The Council and the LCMR also approved the acquisition of two other parcels in 1996.

DISCUSSION: The MPOSC asked whether 7208 Marth Road and 7001 Marth Road (east of 7300 Marth Rd.) would have to be acquired in the future. City of Bloomington staff replied that 7208 Marth Road could be avoided, but 7001 Marth Road would need to be acquired to make the trail feasible. The Commission also asked if the trail could be routed on Marth Road. City staff replied that it would be unsafe to do so.

RECOMMENDATION:

That the Metropolitan Council:

1. Authorize an amendment increasing Grant SG-95-83 \$55,000 from 1991 Metro. Council bonds for a new total of \$200,000 to acquire 8.6 acres in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve. This amendment is subject to approval by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources as an amendment to the 1995 ETF appropriation workprogram.

2. Authorize a grant of \$153,000 to Bloomington consisting of \$37,800 of 1995 Environmental Trust Funds and \$88,200 of 1996-97 Metro. Council bonds and \$27,000 of 1991 Metro. Council bonds to acquire 7300 Marth Road in Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve--Bloomington. This grant is subject to approval by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources as an amendment to the 1995 ETF appropriation workprogram.

INTRODUCTION

Hennepin Parks and the City of Bloomington have submitted the following requests for inholding acquisition grants:

A \$ 55,000 increase to grant SG-95-83 for an 8.6 acre parcel in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve

A \$153,000 grant to acquire 7300 Marth Road in the Corridor Park section of Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve.

\$ 208,000 TOTAL GRANT REQUESTS

The Council has \$217,559 of inholding acquisition funds from three sources:

- \$ 38,519 of 1995 Environmental Trust Fund revenue
- \$ 89,878 of 1996-97 Metro. Council bonds
- \$ 89,162 of 1991 Metro. Council bonds of which \$73,000 had been set-aside until June 30, 1997 for the M.E. Gibson parcel in Lake Byllesby Regional Park. The landowner decided not to sell the parcel so the funds are ______now available for other land acquisitions.

\$ 217,559 TOTAL REVENUE FOR INHOLDING GRANTS

This memorandum will analyze the requests and recommends funding both requests conditioned on approval by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources.

ANALYSIS

As part of a \$3.95 million 1995 Environmental Trust Fund (ETF) appropriation, the Metropolitan Council allocated \$161,000 for inholding acquisitions and committed to issue \$374,000 of Council bonds as a match (Total of \$535,000). The Council bond portion for this purpose is 70% instead of 40% because other projects financed with this appropriation are funded with higher State fund portions. In total, the Council's bond portion for all projects is 40%.

To-date three parcels have been approved by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources:

8.6 acre parcel in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve---Hennepin Parks with a grant of \$145,000 (SG-95-83) approved in 1995. However, Hennepin Parks needs an additional \$55,000 because the appraisals for this parcel are significantly higher than the 1992 Assessed Market Value on this property. Land prices have risen since then (See Attachment 1, letter from Hennepin Parks)

2. 2.77 acres in Bald Eagle-Otter Lake Regional Park--Ramsey County with a grant of \$139,000 approved in 1996.

3. 1.45 acre Nesbitt parcel in Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve with a grant of \$125,000 approved in 1996.

A balance of \$128,398 remains including \$38,519 of Environmental Trust Funds and \$89,878 of Metro. Council bonds. The ETF appropriation must be spent by June 30, 1999. As mentioned in the introduction, the Council also has \$89,162 of 1991 Metro. Council bonds allocated for inholding acquisitions for a total of \$217,559 available for inholding acquisitions.

The following criteria were used in 1995 and 1996 to evaluate inholding acquisition grant requests and are applied again for 7300 Marth Road parcel only since the 8.6 acre parcel in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve was already evaluated and approved in 1995.

Criteria 1. Is the request consistent with a Metropolitan Council approved master plan? Yes.

Criteria 2. Describe the land to be acquired including the condition of any residence on the parcel and its general location in a park or trail. If a residence is being acquired, estimate the value of the residence elative to the cost of the whole parcel.

7300 Marth Road, Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve--Bloomington

This half-acre lot includes a residence and is needed for a trail linking Tierney's Woods and Corridor Park sections of the Park Reserve. The parcel cannot be subdivided with the home sold on a separate lot since the resulting lot would not comply to minimum lot size requirements of the City. Furthermore, there is no other viable alternative to routing the trail around the parcel due to its close proximity to I-494 right-of-way on the north and Marth Road on the south. (See Attachment 2). More detailed maps with scale indicating the narrow configuration and photos will be presented at the July 1 MPOSC meeting.

Criteria 3. State reasons why land should be acquired now based on Metropolitan Council park funding priority policy 3 (for regional parks and park reserves) or policy 4 (for regional trails). This parcel is in a park reserve.

Policy 3 (as revised in the Trails Policy Amendment) states:

The priority rating for acquiring park and park reserve lands identified in an acceptable master plan for the regional system through purchase with regional funds is as follows:

1. Lands essential to protect the natural resources that define a park or park reserve and make it usable to the public as planned. (It is particularly important to acquire lands in this category that face the threat of being lost to the system if timely action is not taken).

2. Lands considered essential for the park or park reserve to reach its full regional service potential as defined in the Council's system plan.

7300 Marth Road, Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve--Bloomington

Bloomington City staff state in their request that the parcel is at a key location in the park to make a trail connection between the Tierney's Woods and Corridor Park sections of the park reserve. Council staff find that this parcel meets priority 1 of the policy because of its location and ability to make the trail link for this park function as planned. Unfortunately, the parcel cannot be subdivided to remove the residential part of the parcel from the vacant part.

Prioritized Acquisitions for Environmental Trust Funds and Metro. Council bonds

Because there is sufficient funds to meet the requests from both Hennepin Parks and the City of Bloomington, no priority is proposed. If the LCMR approves the acquisition at 7300 Marth Road and the increase to grant SG-95-83, there would be \$9,559 left for inholdings. This essentially spends down the account.

Conclusions

1. Hennepin Parks and the City of Bloomington have submitted requests for financing inholding land acquisitions with 1995 Environmental Trust Funds and Metropolitan Council bonds totaling \$208,000. There is \$217,559 available.

2. Allocating \$55,000 more for Grant SG-95-83 to acquire 8.6 acres with home in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve and \$153,000 to acquire a half-acre lot with home in the Corridor Park section of Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve would finance acquisition of parcels that met the highest priority of the Council's land acquisition policy for regional parks. It would also leave \$9,559 for other land acquisitions.

Recommendations

That the Metropolitan Council:

1. Authorize an amendment increasing Grant SG-95-83 \$55,000 from 1991 Metro. Council bonds for a new total of \$200,000 to acquire 8.6 acres in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve. This amendment is subject to approval by the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources as an amendment to the 1995 ETF appropriation workprogram.

2. Authorize a grant of \$153,000 to Bloomington consisting of \$37,800 of 1995 Environmental Trust Funds and \$88,200 of 1996-97 Metro. Council bonds and \$27,000 of 1991 Metro. Council bonds to acquire 7300 Marth Road in Hyland-Bush-Anderson Lakes Park Reserve--Bloomington. Metropolitan Council Grant Contract SG-95-83 is a \$145,000 acquisition grant to acquire the Kempenich property at Lake Rebecca Park Reserve. The grant funding consists of a State LCMR appropriation of \$43,500 and \$101,500 in Council bond proceeds.

As you may recall, this property has taken some time to acquire due to the need for LCMR review and approval and also, health problems of the owner. The grant amount is, therefore, a four-year old estimate based on the Assessed 'Market Value of the property in 1992. At that time, the assessor's market value was only \$94,700; it currently is \$144,000. As an example of how rapidly values for "semi-rural" acreage are rising, another property in Lake Rebecca Park Reserve just sold for \$163,400, although the assessor has it valued at \$101,100 in 1992.

This is by way of getting to the gist of this matter, which is that the two appraisals I have on the Kempenich property indicate a current value of \$187,000. With relocation costs of \$4,000, appraisals of \$1,000, legal costs of \$5,000, and contingencies of \$3,000, a new grant total of \$200,000 would be a current estimate of total costs.

Hennepin Parks therefore requests an amendment to Grant Contract SG-95-83 of \$55,000 for a new total of \$200,000.

Washington County negotiated the purchase of Ceridain Employees' Recreational Area (571 acres) with the Ceridian Employees' Recreational Foundation. The County prepared a master plan of the park for the Metropolitan Council to use in determining whether or not the park met the criteria for regional park designation. After review by the Council, 371 acres (Parcel "B") were determined to be regionally significant. The remaining 208 acres (Parcel "A") were considered highly desirable for future park purposes by the County Board of Commissioners and was purchased. The total acreage is operated and maintained by the County as a regional park.

Parcel "A" - 208 acres, purchased 10/31/96 by Washington County for \$1,130,202.

Parcel "B" - 371 acres, acquired under a lease/purchase agreement from the Ceridain Employees' Recreational Foundation 10/31/96. The County exercised an option to purchase the 371 acres on 12/31/97. Costs to acquire Parcel "B": \$4,340,000. The purchase was financed by County levy of \$2,940,000 and State/Metro Grant of \$1,400,000. Based upon Metropolitan Council policy Washington County is eligible for full reimbursement of land designated as a regional park. The request for the current LCMR Work Program is \$840,000.

Description: An 864 square foot maintenance and trash/recycling building is needed at West Bush Lake Park. The garage building will improve the efficiency and quality of regional park maintenance services by eliminating the need to store and haul equipment from other locations. Currently there is no maintenance or storage facility on the west side of Bush Lake.
