As part of the required work program, criteria and priorities for planned acquisition and restoration activities must be submitted to the Legislative Commission on Minnesota Resources for review and approval. Land acquired with this appropriation must be sufficiently improved to meet at least minimum management standards as determined by the Commissioner of Natural Resources. Any land acquired in fee title by the Commissioner of Natural Resources with money from this appropriation must be

The appropriation is available until June 30, 2004, at which time the project must be completed and final products delivered, unless an earlier date is specified in the work program.

Overall Project Outcome and Results

The purpose of the project was to acquire permanent conservation easements within the Southern Lakes (10) project area in order to conserve and restore Big Woods habitats. This project resulted in the acquisition of 10 tracts totaling 713 acres of permanent easements held by the State of Minnesota, Department of Natural Resources-Forestry. The total value of the 10 tracts was \$1,984,900. Of this total, \$500,000 was provided by the LCMR grant, \$1,100,000 was provided by U.S. Forest Service Forest Legacy Program grants, and \$384,900 was donated by landowners to the State of Minnesota in bargain sales. These results greatly exceed the original targets of 420 acres protected and \$500,000 in match dollars. The project was especially critical in providing the needed funding to acquire the professional services such as appraisals, surveys, title opinions, etc and in providing the required non-federal match of the Federal Forest Legacy Program.

The Big Woods of South-central Minnesota is one of Minnesota's most endangered and fragmented forest ecosystems. All of these tracts are adjacent to or near significant state and county protected Big Woods remnants in Rice County including Nerstrand Big Woods State Park, Boyd Wildlife Management Area, Cannon River Wilderness County Park, and Caron County Park, and the protection of these tracts will help preserve this valuable natural heritage for Minnesota. All these tracts will remain in private ownership, landowners will continue to pay property taxes, and all will be managed with guidance from Forest Stewardship Plans. The easements will be annually monitored by the Division of Forestry.

The project targeted landowners in the Cannon River Watershed portion of project area 10, many who had been involved with previous LCMR supported educational, conservation and stewardship efforts in the Big Woods led by the Cannon River Watershed Partnership in cooperation with DNR-Forestry. The earlier efforts greatly contributed to the success of the current project by helping prepare landowners knowledgeable about Big Woods conservation and willing to embrace permanent protection.

Project Results Use and Dissemination

The results of this project have been disseminated through several program presentations throughout Minnesota (Grand Rapids, Duluth, Lake City, Brainerd, Faribault, Nerstrand, Morristown), through regular Forest Legacy Program progress reports submitted to the Forest Service, and by the Forest Service in annual Forest Legacy Program Reports. Additionally, DNR-Division of Forestry will build use the results of this program to continue to improve our private lands stewardship programs in general and the Forest Legacy Program specifically.

VI. Past, Present and Future Spending

A. Past Spending:

The Division of Forestry has received from the US Forest Service grants of \$906,000 in 2001 and \$678,000 in 2000 to acquire conservation easements on 593

acres and 470 acres respectively in the Big Woods of Rice County. The nonfederal contribution to these two grants will be a minimum of \$869,000. One tract, 111 acres has closed using \$238,000 of the 2000 federal grant. The remaining tracts for acquisition are detailed above. The Division of Forestry coordinates acquisition of easements and matching funds for the Forest Legacy Program.

B. Current and Future Spending:

The long term-plan of the Division is to acquire 2000 acres of Big Woods Forest Conservation easements in selected areas of Rice County.

C. Project Partners

The Big Woods Project is comprised of local landowners, government agencies. who help promote protection, restoration, and maintenance of Big Woods in Rice County. The Nature Conservancy of Minnesota, the Cannon River Watershed Partnership, Friends of 7-Mile Woods, and the Friends of the Cannon River Wilderness Area have been a Long-time supporter of the group. The DNR interdisciplinary Big Woods Team provides review and coordination for this and other projects in the Big Woods. The USDA Forest Service Northeastern Area State and Private Forestry provides funding and support to acquire forest conservation easements through the Forest Legacy Program. No LCMR funds will support project partners.

D.Time:

Project would extend until June 30, 2004 to allow sufficient time to close on all projects.

VII. Dissemination

Easement tracts will be posted and notice provide in the Big Woods Update-the newsletter of the Big Woods Project. Use of Forest Legacy funds are reported to U.S. Congress and program accomplishments are widely distributed by the U.S. Forest Service.

VIII. Location

Within the established area 10, we will target large tracts, tracts that are part of a Larger block of Big Woods forest, and tracts that are adjacent to public land or protected land. Emphasis will be placed on lands that also meet the criteria of the Federal Forest Legacy Program. All projects will be located in Project Area 10, specifically Rice County.

IX. Reporting Requirements

Progress reports for this work program will be submitted to MN Waterfowl Association on May 31, 2002, November 30, 2002, March 30, 2003, November 30, 2003, and July 1, 2004.

Conservation easements will be acquired by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry, in the Southern Lakes (10) project area to conserve and restore remaining Big Woods habitat. A minimum of 420 acres of Big Woods habitat will be protected under this program. This project will complement and supplement two projects currently funded by the U.S. Forest Service Forest Legacy Program to fund the acquisition of conservation easements in Minnesota's Big Woods.

Applications approved for Forest Service Match with Federal Forest Legacy Dollars: 21 tracts for 1196 acres

Of the 21 tracts approved for easement acquisition, 9 appraisals have been completed, 5 offers have been accepted, and one landowner has withdrawn due to death of a spouse. Surveys have been completed on the 5 tracts where offers have been accepted. One tract has been withdrawn due to sale to Nerstrand Big Woods State Park.

Several issues have developed relative to acquisition of these easements. Those issues include:

- Appraisal of properties where gravel resources are present-a new state law requires additional due diligence with regard to appraisal and notification where gravel resources are likely present on the property.
- Review appraisals-the Forest Service requires all appraisals to meet their yellow book standards and to be reported in a format acceptable to them. Our DNR Lands and Minerals Division has been working with the Forest Service Forest Legacy staff to develop the acceptable reporting format.

• Subordination of mortgage-several tracts have existing mortgages on them that requires the mortgage holder to sign-off on the easement. That sign-off has been slow in coming.

Federal Forest Legacy Program Funds totaling \$2,346,000 is currently committed to implement acquisition of the 21 tracts noted above.

Change request is due to the following factors: 1. Forest Service Forest Legacy Program grants pay for acquisition costs, but not professional services. Those services are being paid from the LCMR grant; 2. We will soon begin acquisition of Federal FY2002 Forest Legacy Program tracts, thus creating a demand for additional professional services; and 3.Professional services costs were estimated by lands and minerals to be about 10% of the cost of the purchase, but are coming in at a higher amount.

<u>Change request dated 5/3/04 is due to revised dollar amounts needed for easements</u> <u>compared to professional services fees. The amount of funding initially estimated for</u> <u>professional services compared to easements has been somewhat higher than estimated</u> <u>due to higher than anticipated costs for appraisal services and Lands and Minerals staff</u> time. Additionally, bargain sales reduced the amounts needed for easements.

Remaining Phase I funds have been totally encumbered for three optioned parcels totaling about 200 acres which are due to close in the next few weeks, or prior to June 30, 2004. Closeout of Phase 1 is requested in order to make available Phase 2 funds to pay for appraisals, surveys, and Lands & Minerals staff time for the projects that are ongoing.

VI. Past, Present and Future Spending A. Past Spending:

The Division of Forestry has received from the US Forest Service grants of \$906,000 in 2001 and \$678,000 in 2000 to acquire conservation easements on 593 acres and 470 acres respectively in the Big Woods of Rice County. The non-federal contribution to these two grants will be a minimum of \$869,000. One tract, 111 acres has closed using \$238,000 of the 2000 federal grant. The remaining tracts for acquisition are detailed above. The Division of Forestry coordinates acquisition of easements and matching funds for the Forest Legacy Program.

B. Current and Future Spending:

The long term-plan of the Division is to acquire 2000 acres of Big Woods Forest Conservation easements in selected areas of Rice County.

C. Project Partners

The Big Woods Project is comprised of local landowners, government agencies. who help promote protection, restoration, and maintenance of Big Woods in Rice County. The Nature Conservancy of Minnesota, the Cannon River Watershed Partnership, Friends of 7-Mile Woods, and the Friends of the Cannon River Wilderness Area have been a Long-time supporter of the group. The DNR interdisciplinary Big Woods Team provides review and coordination for this and other projects in the Big Woods. The USDA Forest Service Northeastern Area State and Private Forestry provides funding and support to acquire forest conservation easements through the Forest Legacy Program. No LCMR funds will support project partners.

D.Time:

Project would extend until June 30, 2004 to allow sufficient time to close on all projects.

VII. Dissemination

Easement tracts will be posted and notice provide in the Big Woods Update-the newsletter of the Big Woods Project. Use of Forest Legacy funds are reported to U.S. Congress and program accomplishments are widely distributed by the U.S. Forest Service.

VIII. Location

Within the established area 10, we will target large tracts, tracts that are part of a Larger block of Big Woods forest, and tracts that are adjacent to public land or protected land. Emphasis will be placed on lands that also meet the criteria of the Federal Forest Legacy Program. All projects will be located in Project Area 10, specifically Rice County.

IX. Reporting Requirements

Progress reports for this work program will be submitted to MN Waterfowl Association on May 31, 2002, November 30, 2002, March 30, 2003, November 30, 2003, and July 1, 2004.
