Dear Agency Heads,

Minnesota's SmartFleet Committee is happy to report that agencies are continuing to increase their use of E85 fuel in state vehicles. During calendar year 2009 agencies used 816,568 gallons of E85 fuel. This is up from 650,036 gallons during the same time period in 2008.

Attached is the fleet retail fuel report for calendar year 2009. This report shows that state agencies together are using 15.3 percent E85 fuel and 84.7 percent petroleum-based gasoline in state vehicles. The report provides a summary of the fleet fuel purchases, by agency, through the Wright Express and Voyager fuel cards. Please share this report with the operating divisions of your agency. *Please direct vehicle operators to use E85 whenever it is available.* 

While we are making progress toward the Governor's goal, there is room for increasing the use of E85. The state fleet currently includes approximately 2,500 flex-fuel vehicles that are capable of using E85 fuel, and there are more than 350 E85 retailers across the state. Nearly all E85 vehicles are marked with fuel door decals identifying E85 as the fuel of choice. If there is any question concerning fuel compatibility, please contact your agency fleet office or Admin's Fleet Services Division.

Executive Order 04-10 calls for Minnesota state government to reduce the quantity of petroleum fuels consumed in transportation. Using E85 fuel instead of gasoline will help move the state toward accomplishing this goal.
